Brief Project Description*

Buncombe County is undergoing a property analysis and site planning for the "Ferry Road property". The property analysis is underway and has identified potential development scenarios for mixed use, mixed income housing that is supported by recreational, commercial and institutional uses.

As part of the site planning, a detailed evaluation of water, sewer and multi-modal transportation access will be conducted to include estimated pricing. This infrastructure is necessary to improve the site for potential development scenarios that will allow the utilization of the property to meet Buncombe County's Strategic Plan goals. This project supports goals for educated and capable community, resident well-being, vibrant economy, and equity. This infrastructure will enable the development of affordable housing, provide access to cultural and recreational opportunities, and seek to conserve environmentally sensitive land (e.g., wetlands) on the property and along the French Broad River.

Project Plan*

Project Selection:

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Buncombe County has secured a vendor to analyze infrastructure needs on the site. The vendor will provide estimated costs for infrastructure for the development scenarios that are developed. Once a final scenario is selected Buncombe County will work with the respective transportation, water and sewer agencies to define construction costs and timeline.

Project Approval:

Buncombe County staff will request approval of the Buncombe County Board of Commissioners to identify a specific development scenario and then work with the respective water and sewer agencies.

Project Implementation:

The project will be administered and constructed by the Department of Transportation (DOT), Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) and the City of Asheville. The timeframe for this project is two years from project award.

Project Evaluation:

The project will include performance metrics for number of users impacted (e.g., parcels with water and sewer access).

Statement of Need*

This project will provide transportation, water and sewer infrastructure to the Ferry Road parcel. The parcel is approximately 200 acres and has both MSD and City Water lines present at adjacent parcels. The extension of this infrastructure will enable the development of the site for mixed use, mixed income housing that is supported by recreational, commercial and institutional uses. Without this infrastructure, the site will remain undeveloped.

Previous attempts to develop the property did not directly address Buncombe County Strategic Plan goals. Specifically, prior development scenarios did not emphasize affordable housing, environmental conservation, and practical recreation opportunities.

The creation of affordable housing is a critical need in Buncombe County and is reflected as a goal in the Buncombe 2025 Strategic Plan (goal: Implement land use strategies that encourage affordable housing near transportation and jobs). This site provides an opportunity for Buncombe County to encourage the development of additional affordable units as the sole land owner of the site in partnership with nonprofit/for profit development teams. Additionally, the location of the site provides an opportunity to create housing near the Biltmore Park West Employment hub, the planned AB Tech Workforce training center, nearby public transportation routes on Brevard Road, and recreational opportunities at Bent Creek River Park.

Link to COVID-19*

Although the pandemic's impacts have been widespread, both the public health and economic impacts of the pandemic have fallen most severely on communities and populations disadvantaged before it began. Low-income communities, people of color, and Tribal communities have faced higher rates of infection,

hospitalization, and death, as well as higher rates of unemployment and lack of basic necessities like food and housing. Pre-existing social vulnerabilities magnified the pandemic in these communities, where a reduced ability to work from home and, frequently, denser housing amplified the risk of infection.

As such, the ARPA prioritizes investments in water, sewer, broadband, and housing that will mitigate those impacts. ARPA guidance indicates that local governments may use the funds to invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure. Specifically, these investments include making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet. The Interim Final Rule states that "water infrastructure projects may include building or upgrading facilities and transmission, distribution, and storage systems, including the replacement of lead service lines."

The guidance issued by the Department of Treasury for the American Rescue Plan specifically cites water and sewer infrastructure as an eligible use of the funding. Further, this infrastructure investment will enable the development of affordable housing which is identified as an eligible use of funding. Specifically: "Building stronger neighborhoods and communities, including: supportive housing and other services for individuals experiencing homelessness, development of affordable housing, and housing vouchers and assistance relocating to neighborhoods with higher levels of economic opportunity."

Population Served*

This project will serve numerous residents of Buncombe County by providing affordable housing options in a mixed use, mixed income community. Affordable housing is a critical need in Buncombe County and access to housing is a key issue for those disproportionately impacted by COVID-19, including but not limited to, individuals experiencing homelessness and low-income individuals. Additionally, the development will include public recreational opportunities (e.g., greenway, river access) that will benefit all residents of Buncombe County.

By permitting funds to be used for water and sewer infrastructure needs, Congress recognized the critical role that clean drinking water and services for the collection and treatment of wastewater and stormwater play in protecting public health. ARP is designed to provide funding for projects that protect public health and safety by ensuring compliance with wastewater and drinking water health standards.

This project will support equity by creating additional water and sewer infrastructure that will enable the development of affordable housing. Specifically: "Building stronger neighborhoods and communities, including: supportive housing and other services for individuals experiencing homelessness, development of affordable housing, and housing vouchers and assistance relocating to neighborhoods with higher levels of economic opportunity."
