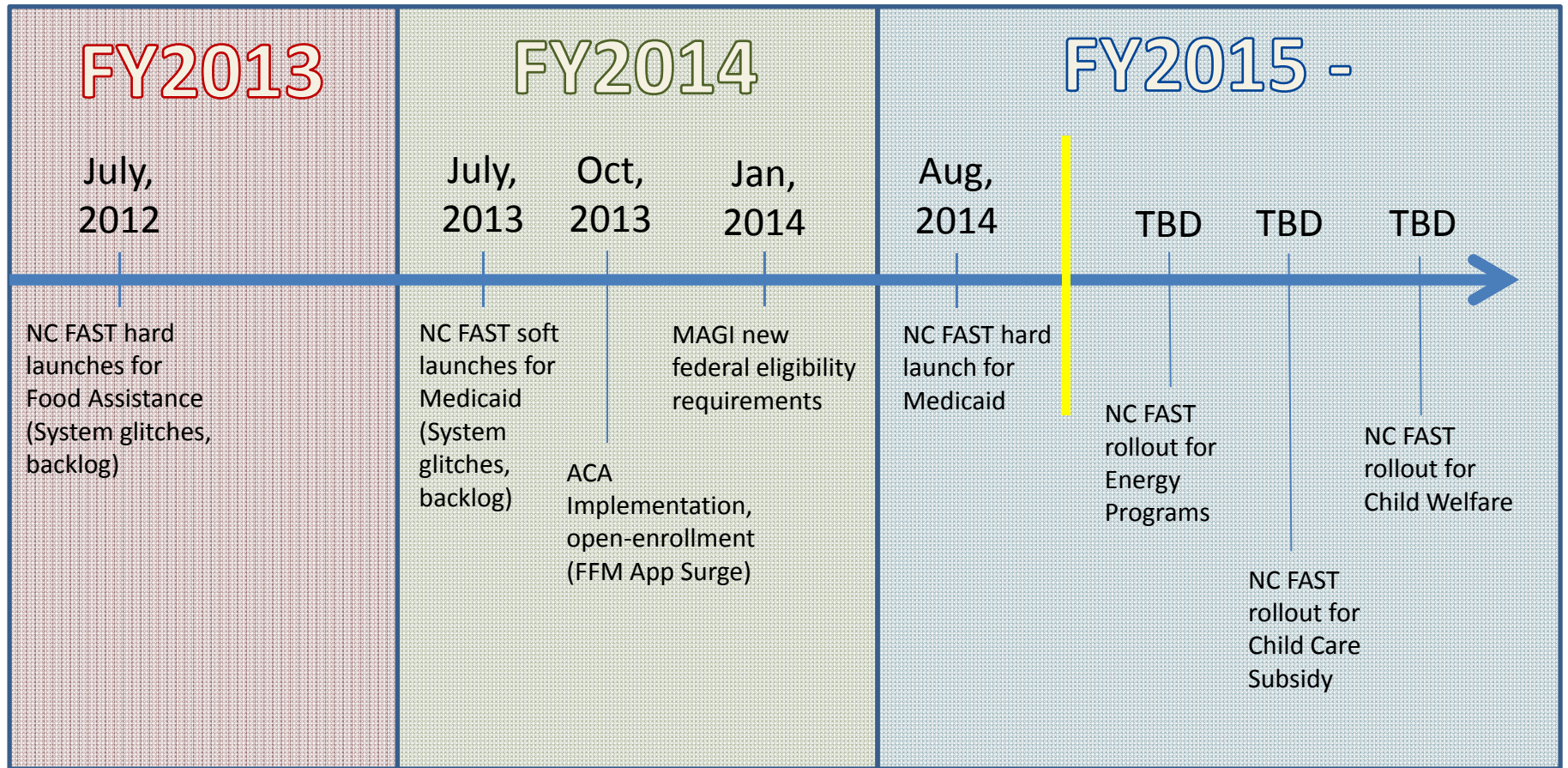

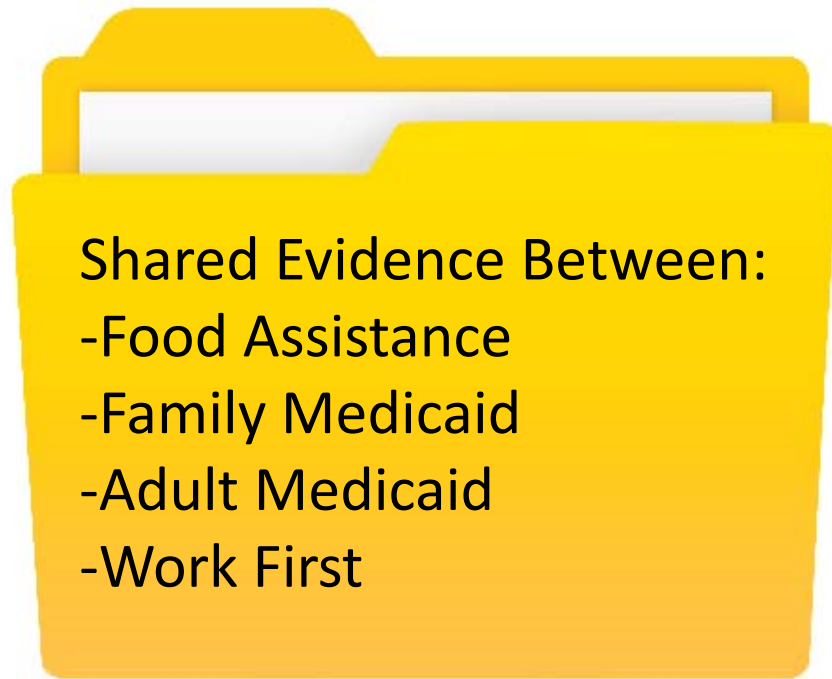

- More information inputted, but less time spent having to determine eligibility

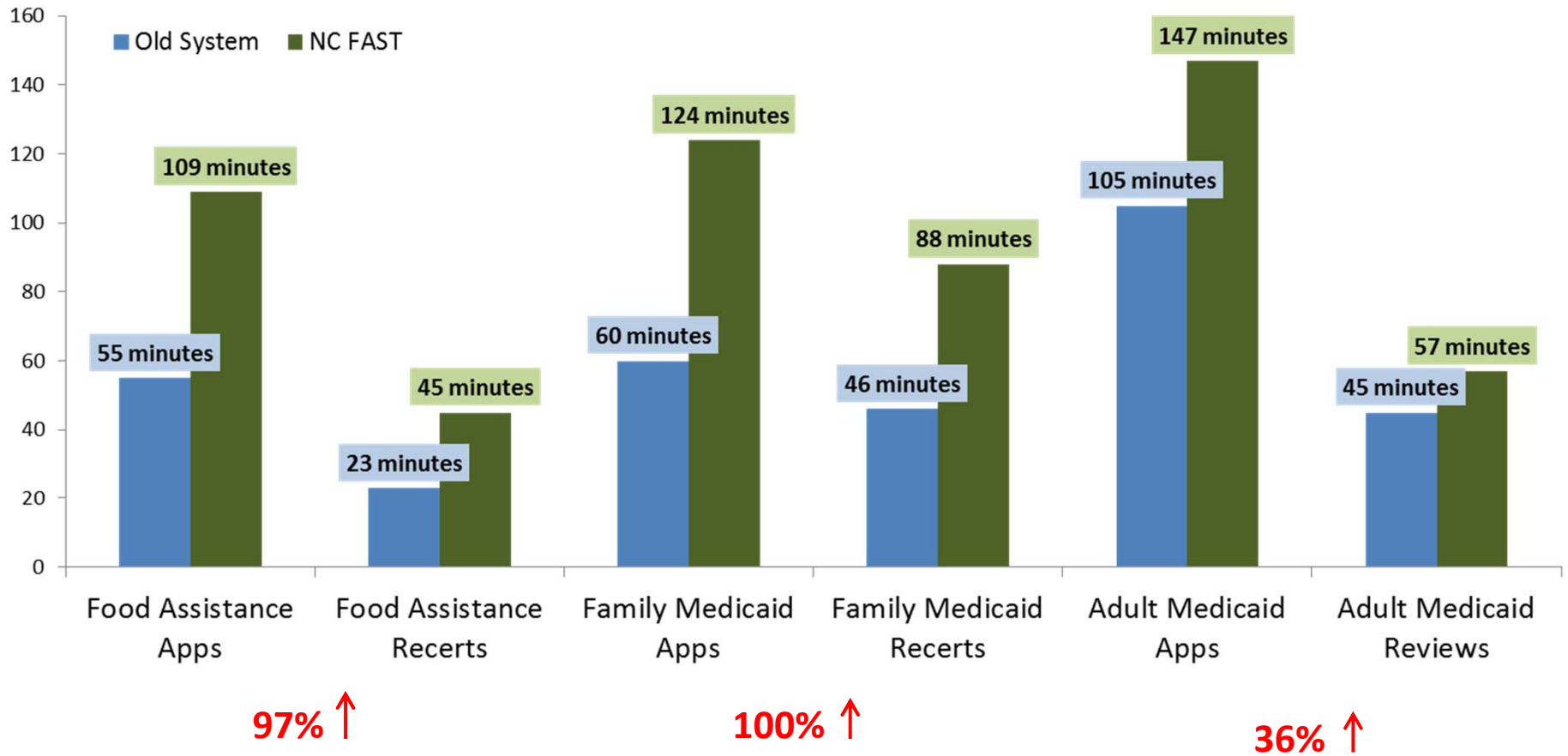

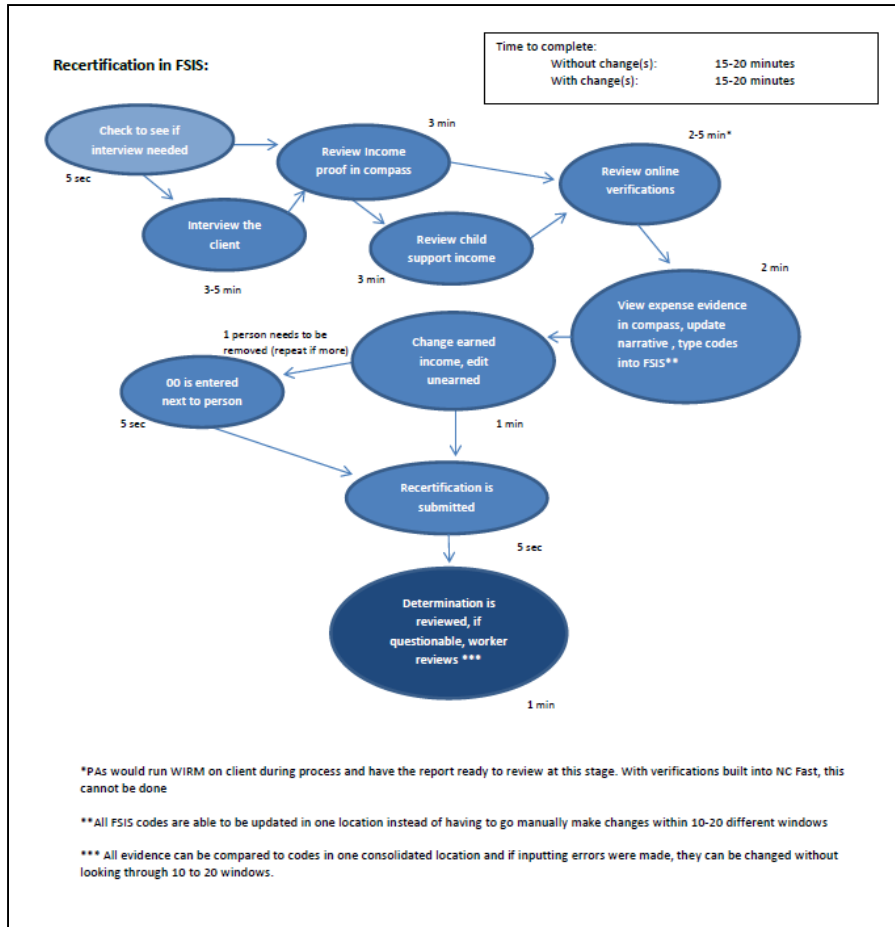

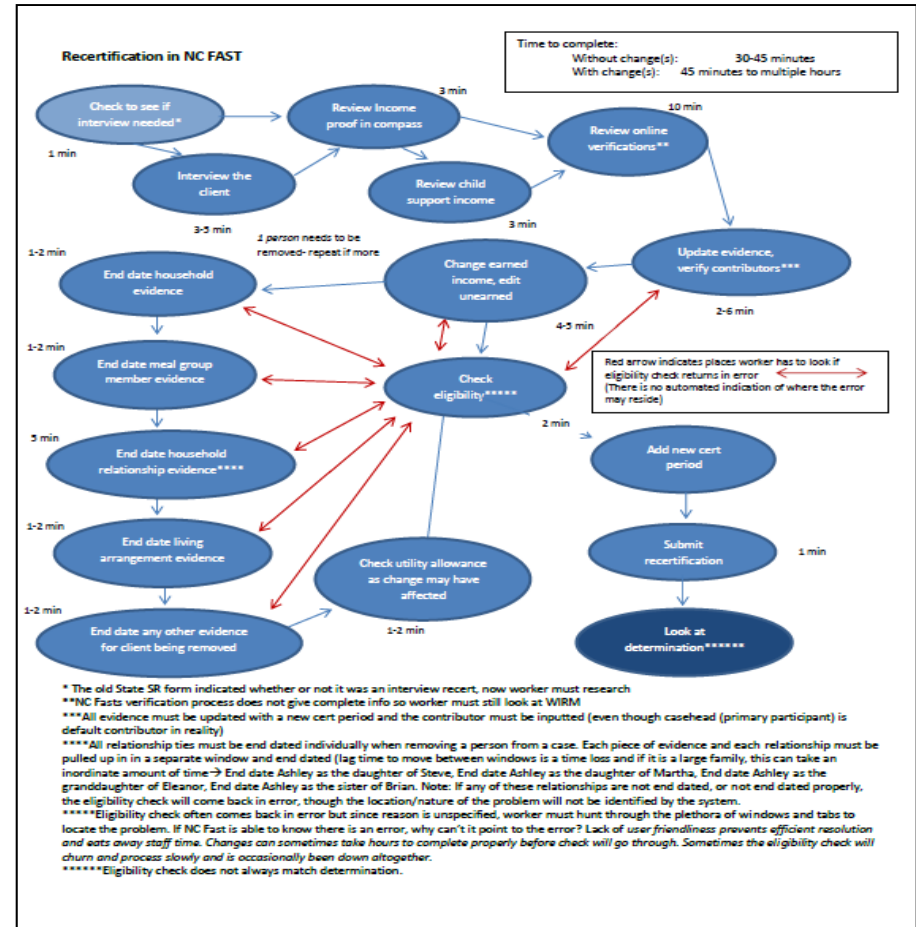

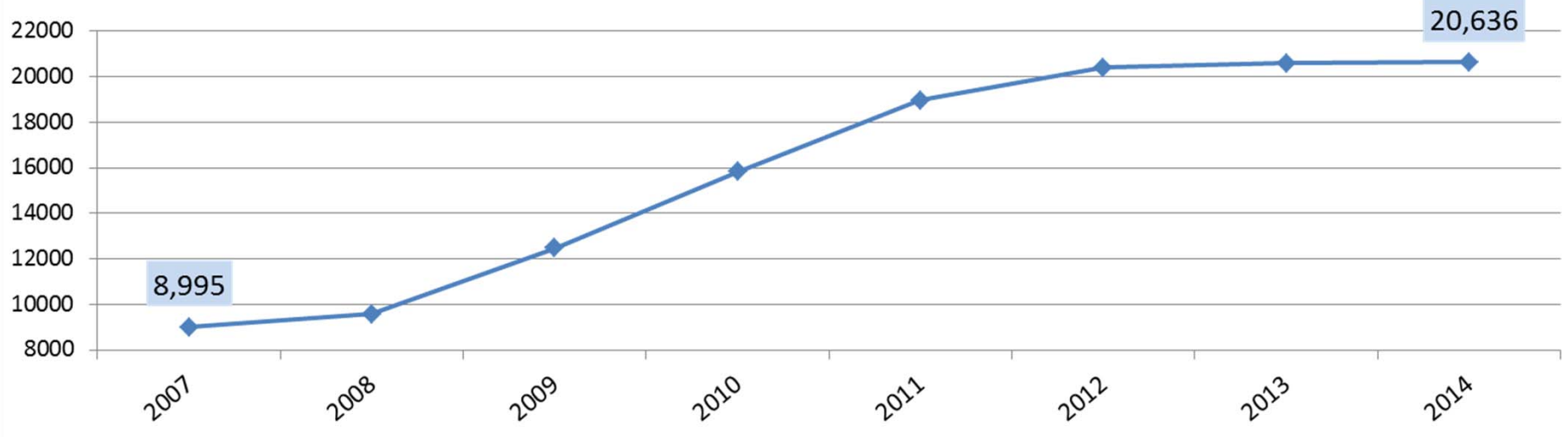

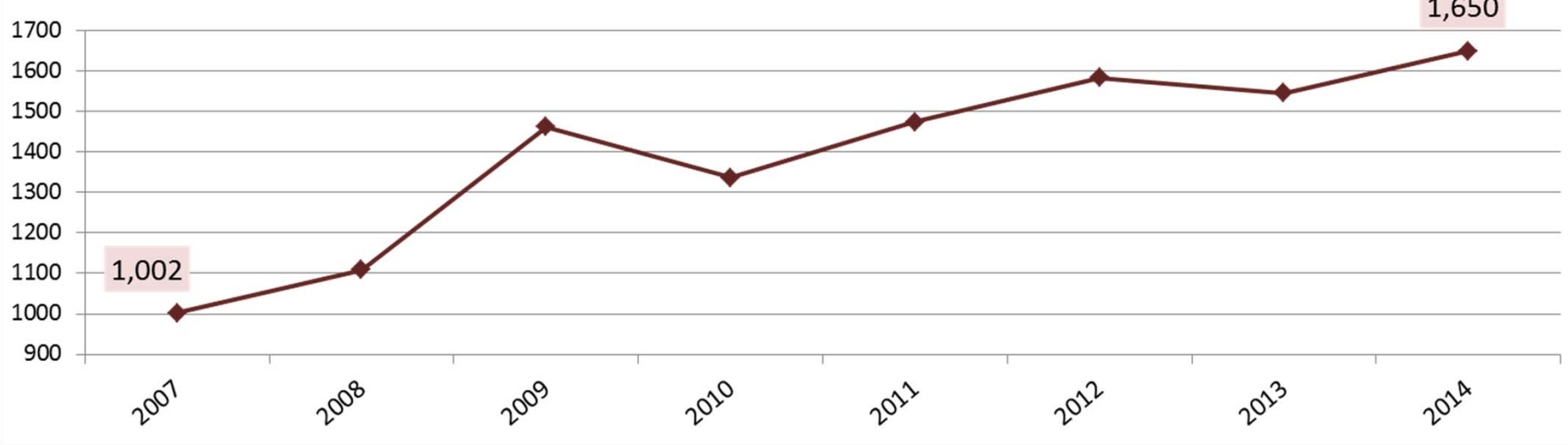

### Buncombe County Food Assistance Households FY2007 - FY2014

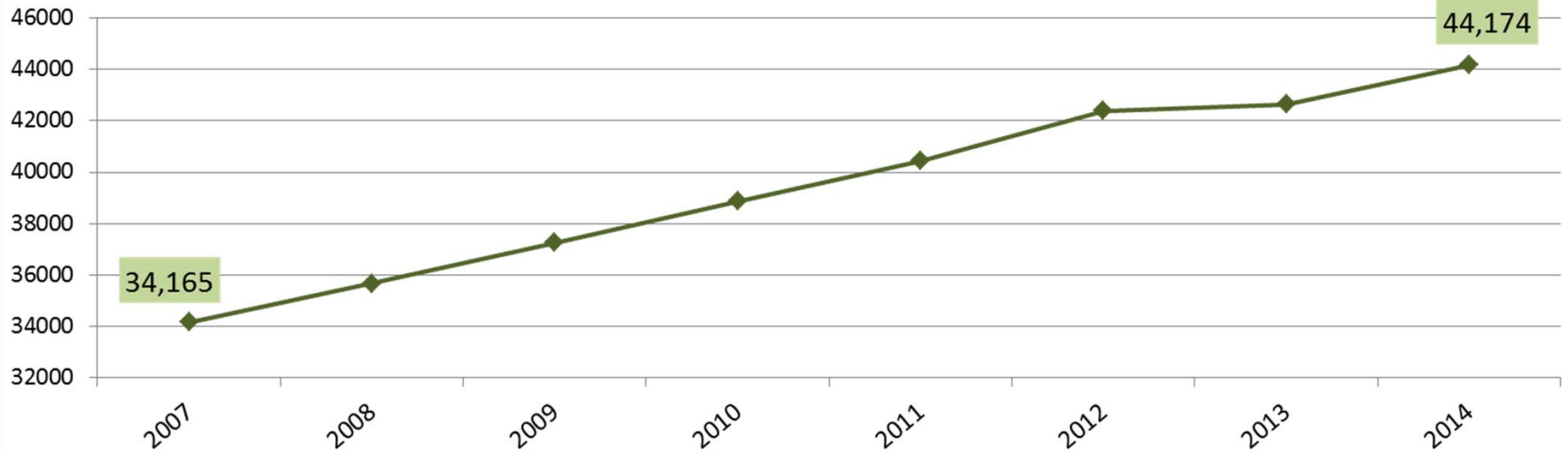


### Buncombe County Food Assistance Applications Avg. Per Month FY2007 - FY2014

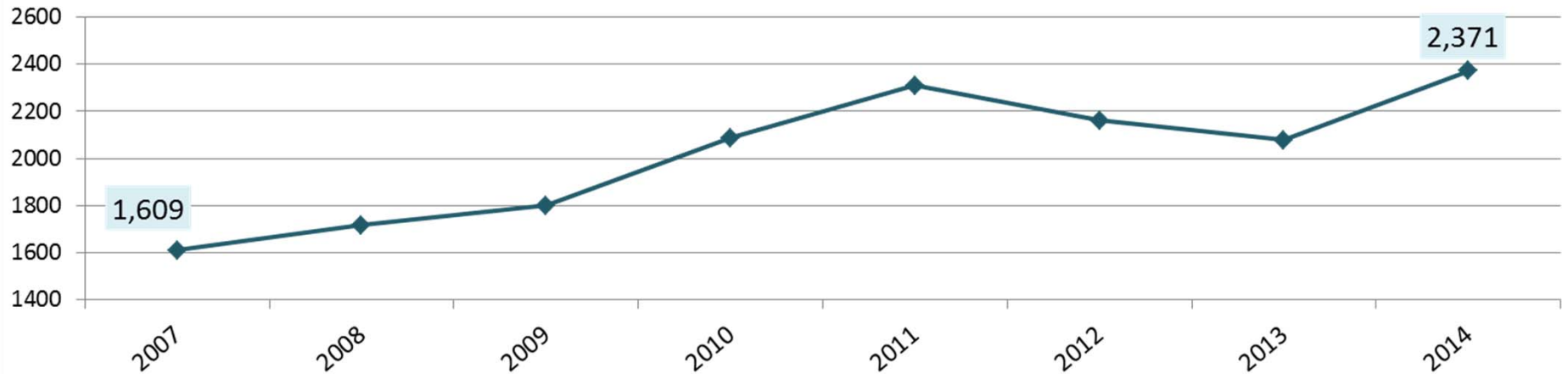




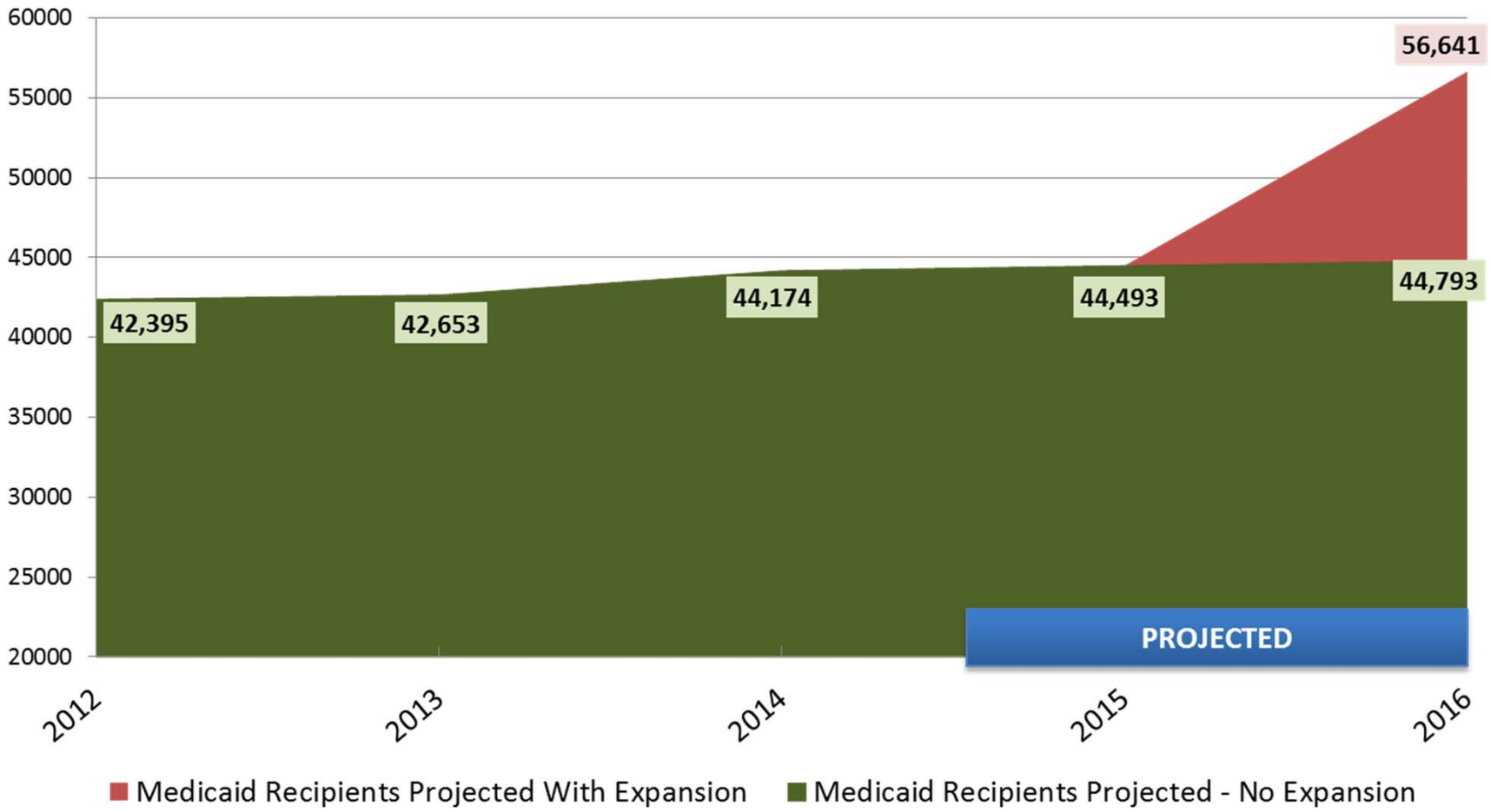
### Buncombe County Medicaid Recipients FY2007 - FY2014



### Buncombe County Medicaid Applications Avg. Per Month FY2007 - FY2014

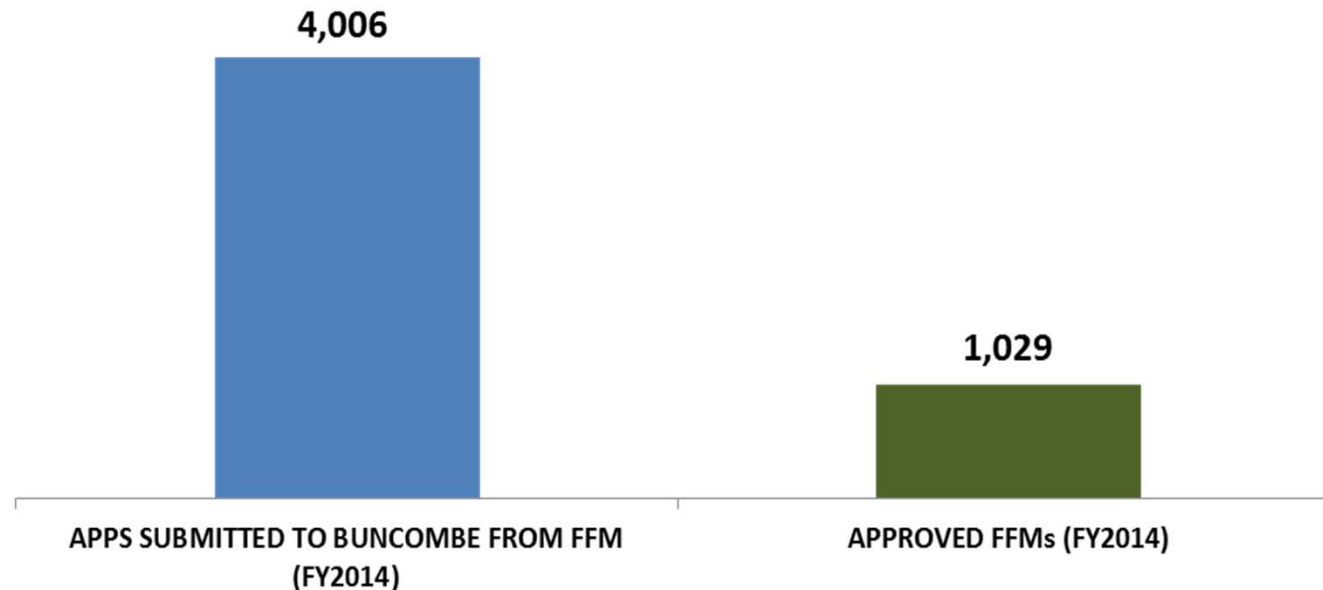


### Buncombe County Medicaid Recipients Projected With and Without Expansion FY2012 - FY2016

# Current Workload Impact of Affordable Care Act without expansion



- **26%** were **approved**
- **2.07** hours to complete an application
- Annual reapplication for subsidy required
- **8,292** hours of work from ACA applications → approximately **6 FTEs worth of annual labor**

# Implementation of NCFAST is a State-wide Issue

- Single largest software conversion in the State's history
- Federal action as a result of state-wide challenges to meet timeliness and quality standards
- DHHS issues recommended staffing requirements to counties

# Calculating Needed Staff

## Considerations:

- Avg. labor time to complete work by program and work type (Time Studies)
- Incoming work count by program and work type (Data trends)
- Total potential 'productive' work hours per FTE (Industry Research)
- Avg. number of staff on leave throughout year (Data Trends)
- Avg. number of positions vacant at any point in time (Data Trends)
- number of positions in basic training (Data Trends)
- Baseline staffing need compared against current staffing levels  
>Staffing Deficit Identified
- Capacity for surge projects as NC FAST continues to roll out  
>NC FAST Lessons Learned

# Why we can't continue with Temp Employees as solution

- ACA requirement on Jan 1, 2015: temporary employees must be offered our health insurance
- 9-12 months to train for full competency
  - Complexity of policy and technology
- Merited government employees required to determine eligibility



# Given Buncombe County System Efficiencies:

## 23 additional positions needed

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Savings of 18 positions based on NC Fast projected staffing need

*Does not take into account possible Medicaid Expansion – approximately 30 more FTEs*
