Project Descriptions and Justification for Funding Recommendations

Mountain Housing Opportunities (MHO)	MHO proposes to build a 60-unit affordable rental housing community for families at 2244 US 70, Swannanoa, NC. East Haven will be constructed as garden apartments in five buildings. A separate management office and community room will be located in a separate building. The site is within one tenth mile of an Ingles grocery and pharmacy. It is also a short distance from shopping, restaurants, schools and employment.	East Haven will provide 60 attractive, affordable rental homes to low-income families in Swannanoa. Eligible families will have incomes at 60% or less of the area median income. The development will offer rents at a fraction of market rents. Buncombe County has supported this project with \$125,000 in Affordable Housing Services Funds and also last years HOME County Match for \$75,000.
Homeward Bound Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP)	Homeward Bound submitted an application to provide financial assistance and housing stabilization services to prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless and to help those experiencing homelessness be rapidly re-housed and stabilize. This program targets individuals and families who would become or remain homeless if not for this assistance.	Homeward Bounds HPRP program supports the Asheville-Buncombe 10-Year plan to end homelessness. Homeward Bound will provide prevention assistance to stop the flow of individuals coming into the homeless service system and rapid re-housing assistance to individuals experiencing homelessness to access permanent housing.
Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity AAHH	AAHH submitted an application to build 10 new, affordable, Green built NC and System Visior certified homes off Taft Ave. in the Shiloh community.
