NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Buncombe as follows:

1. That September 21, 2015 be proclaimed

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE

in Buncombe County.

2. That this Board does hereby urge all agencies, organizations, schools, places of worship and individuals in our County to commemorate in an appropriate manner the International Day of Peace.
