Project Description

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Description of Project

ABIPA's Community Health Action Team offers support to our community outreach efforts. .CHAT deploys a team of community health workers trained to connect community members to community resources. This special team of community health workers will support at-risk populations through two specific tactics. The first focus of CHAT is to provide administrative support to our CSNs by administering health education and connecting them other needed community supports to identified clients that need more extensive support in specified pathways. The second strategy connects residents to primary care homes and we work with primary care physicians to follow up with their patients that need additional community supports to manage chronic illnesses. The unique attribute of our program is direct connection to community members. The primary meeting method is with them in their homes and community settings. In addition to connecting individuals to community resources all clients complete a Health Risk Assessment that is assessed by our Nurse Casemanger and additional education is available for those that need more extensive education or counseling. We connect citizens and communities with health and human services and other resources available in Buncombe county, however we go deeper. The CSNs trained by ABIPA are unique because we equip them with the extra layer of training and experience in being Community Health Workers. Through this program we are able to address the social determinants of health in addition to the direct health that is impacted by people simply trying to survive. We meet people where they are by going door to door and making ourselves available in other community settings. The citizens that we encounter have complex life issues that require more attention than handing them a brochure or giving them a phone number to call. This effort is invaluable, because making the vision that our founder the late Dr. Charles Blair a reality.

The number of people that will be impacted by this promising work is 3,500 which will include the population of the Asheville housing authority which is comprised of 1787 units with approximately 2605 residents, and the Shiloh Community. 300 individuals will successfully complete pathways that they designate needing help with.90 % of participants will report improvements in knowledge about or awareness of health issues. 60% of participants will demonstrate improved health outcomes (e.g., blood glucose level, blood pressure, etc.40% of participants diagnosed with a chronic illness will enroll in and complete a Chronic Disease Self Management class.60% of participants will Increase Primary Care Home utilization.

The target audience of this project includes, minority, underserved, and chronically ill adults 18 years to 80 that live in the 28801, 28803, 28805, and 28806. Referral and recruitment will be attained through our Community Service Navigators and their case load in addition to working with, WNCHS, MAHEC, and the

office of Dr. Larry Rosenberg. In addition we will make our services available to anyone that is referred to us within the county.

The promising practice of utilizing Community Health Workers is highlighted in the 2013 Recommendations From the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Commission to Build a Healthier America. One example shared in this extensive document relays that in an effort to improve care and keep high-risk patients from being re-admitted to the hospital, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' Community-Based Care Transitions Program (CCTP) is connecting patients to local organizations such as social service providers, nursing homes, home health agencies, pharmacies, primary care practices, and other types of health and social service providers in the community. There are numerous examples of promising practices listed in this report. Projects like CHAT are ideal opportunities to leverage the resources and collaborative power that is present in Buncombe County. We are positioned to produce promising practices that can be duplicated in other communities.

We currently utilize the web based One Who Serves Case management system to document client information and follow up. We utilize paper surveys and survey monkey for community surveys and results based accountability and the score card for program evaluation.

Our current technological capacity is very basic. Our major barrier at this time is that we need to upgrade our computers and would need to have more mobile electronic devices for CHAT so that we could minimize paper assessments and evaluations in the field. We have a contracted IT person that we consult with. Our Executive Director JéWana Grier-McEachin is responsible for the adaptation and use of technology within our organization.

Mission Statement: ABIPA promotes economic, social, and health parity achievement for African Americans and other people of color in Buncombe County through advocacy, education, research, and community partnerships. We updated our strategic plan during our January 17, 2014 Board Retreat. One of our three focus areas includes expanding our community health worker model. This funding opportunity would assist us in continuing to advance this organizational goal and our impact on the culture of community health.

In our first year of Community Service Navigation we case managed 144 individuals addressing 390 pathways and helped to conducted Pop Up Markets that served 1864 individuals. At the end of our 2014-15 cycle we had 422 CSN clients, addressed 647 pathways and the pop ups impacted 2388 individuals. This year we are on track to exceed the impact of previous years.
