## **Project Description\***

#### Description of Project

The purpose of this project is to expand our Prevention Education and Counseling programs. This project will increase the hours of our current Prevention Education Coordinator (PEC) from 30 to 37.5 and add an additional 37.5 PEC. The current PEC will expand efforts in providing healthy dating and communication and sexual assault prevention curricula in Buncombe County middle and high schools. The new PEC, informed by a Community Readiness Assessment conducted in early 2015, will "train the trainers" in prevention curricula in four of five communities we have identified as underserved: faith-based, African American, Latino, and Homeless communities (the fifth community, the LGBTQI community, will be addressed by a Tzedek resident). This project will also support a 37.5 hour counselor who will provide sexual assault intervention to children aged 13 and up who are placed in Buncombe County's Foster Care system, whether or not the trauma occurred prior to their 13th birthday.

## How many people will this project serve?\*

Our VOICE projects that, with an additional 7.5 hours of time, our current Prevention Education Coordinator will be able to provide healthy dating and communication and sexual assault prevention curricula to an additional 720 middle- and high-school students. Of these, 540 (75%) will be able to demonstrate increased knowledge about the subject matter. The new PEC will identify 20 community leaders in each of the identified underserved communities and will train them to administer dating and communication and sexual assault prevention curricula. Working with these leaders, the new PEC will provide education to 400 underserved community members throughout the year. Of those to whom we administer pre- and post- tests, 75% will demonstrate increased knowledge. The Counselor will see 70 children in the Foster Care system, 80% (56) will experience a reduction in trauma-related symptoms by utilizing newly learned coping skills and practices.

For the current PEC, the target population is Buncombe County middle- and high- school students. Growing that position from 30 hours to 37.5 hours will mean we will be able to respond to more requests by teachers for education. We have Prevention and Education volunteers who will reach out to teachers, administrators, and school counselors to generate knowledge about our prevention services and who will support the PEC in scheduling outreach opportunities. The new PEC will utilize contacts Our VOICE gained through our Community Awareness Assessment and through our interagency community partnerships to identify leaders within the Faith-Based, African-American, Latino, and Homeless communities. Those contacts will support Our VOICE in organizing outreach opportunities in each of those communities. The Counselor will work closely with the County's Foster Care system to identify teenagers aged 13 and up who are in the Foster Care system and have experienced sexual abuse.

## What key steps will you take to achieve the results of this project?\*

Our VOICE will seek a LCSW or LPC to provide sexual assault intervention to children aged 13 and up in the Foster Care system. We will seek a Bachelor's Level PEC with experience in community organizing and training for underserved populations. These positions will be filled, and our current PEC position expanded, upon availability of funding. Working with County CPS, the counselor will identify children who need our services, and will provide services to meet project objectives. The new PEC will identify leaders in underserved communities who will be taught to implement Dating and Communication and sexual assault prevention curricula, and will offer subsequent technical assistance to those leaders. The current PEC will respond to more requests by middle and high schools. All programs will provide monthly statistics to the Program Director for review, and statistics will be compiled for Board and Executive Director review on a quarterly basis to ensure contract compliance.

## Describe the evidence of success that backs this project's approach.\*

What evidence of success (i.e. evidence-based research, practice model, accreditation, industry standards, and/or other framework) are you using as a basis for your project design?

We will measure the success of the PEC's through pre- and post- tests that are adapted from the Safe Dates curriculum, which is an evidence-based curriculum used throughout our industry. This assessment checks the student's behaviors, attitudes, and intentions, and addresses risk and protective factors for perpetration and victimization from teen dating violence and sexual assault. Each of the specialized communities will have different risk and protective factors, but the assessment tool is adaptive to the audience. We will measure success in counseling as clients experience a reduction in trauma-related symptoms by utilizing newly learned coping skills and practices. This will be measured through the administration of the Trauma Symptom Checklist (TSC), an industry accepted tool used by Rape Crisis Counselors to determine the level of success of clients undergoing treatment for sexual assault. The TSC will be administered during the first and fourth counseling sessions.

Educational pre- and post-tests are graded by the PECs and entered into the back end of Our VOICE's website, which is programmed through WordPress. In addition, the PEC's keep an excel worksheet on our agency's shared drive to capture statistics on numbers served and the rate of increase of knowledge. The spreadsheet is used monthly for reports to the Program Director, who monitors progress toward contract goals. Monthly, the Executive Director compiles statistics and provides a report to the Board for general oversight. The Counselor will keep an excel spreadsheet that shows the scores of the Trauma Symptom Checklist per client at the first and fourth sessions so that the percentage of overall clients showing improvement can be tallied. This information is provided to the Executive Director on a monthly basis so that she may monitor progress toward contract goals. Monthly, the Executive Director reports Counseling statistics to the Board for general oversight.

As a result of a Governor's Crime Commission grant through Buncombe County, Our VOICE will be able to purchase new computers for our entire staff, and these will be properly networked. Each staff member is responsible for entering his/ her own statistics into the appropriate site on our shared drive so that there is routine back-up and statistics are readily available. The Client Services Coordinator is specifically trained on the agency's client database to ensure appropriate client documentation. We do not have an IT department.

Our VOICE proudly serves our mission: In the pursuit of a community that is free of sexual violence, Our VOICE serves all individuals in Buncombe County affected by sexual assault and abuse, through counseling, advocacy and education. We are a non-profit crisis intervention and prevention agency serving victims of sexual violence, age 13 through adult. We reported on our last strategic plan in the Fall of 2014, and have since been engaged in the planning and development of the Family Justice Center. We anticipate engaging in an internal planning process in Spring 2016 as a result of a Melvin R. Lane fund candidacy. This project advances our organizational goals by expanding the following: our counseling program so that we can meet the needs of youth who are particularly vulnerable to sexual assault (those in the Foster Care system), our prevention education program to reach more middle and high-schoolers, and our outreach into populations we have identified as being underserved.

## What expertise/accomplishments do you have that are relevant to the proposed project?\*

We have over 40 years of experience providing counseling. In the past few years, we have tailored counseling to the needs of underserved populations, adding a Bilingual Counselor and a Counselor for victimized men. We have Counselor with expertise in the needs of homeless, LGBTQ, African-American, Latino, and Faith-based communities. We have over 30 years working with schools and systems within Buncombe County to provide preventive education. In the past year, we added a Rape Prevention Education Coordinator to focus on Shifting Boundaries, an evidenced-based curriculum for 6th and 7th graders. Through our Community Readiness Assessment, we have established relationships with leaders in the underserved communities; similarly, we have solid partnerships with community agencies that will support the new PEC as s/he provides outreach to underserved communities. We have volunteers who will dedicate time to helping the PECs in reaching out to their respective audiences.

We have successful collaborations with agencies under the Family Justice Center; through the FJC we will be working more closely with CPS. We work with a variety of partners to support the emotional and practical needs of our counseling clients. We have a close partnership with Buncombe County Schools, as well as other schools within our county, to provide preventive education. We have built relationship with leaders in underserved communities who participated in our Community Readiness Assessment. We will develop relationships with church leaders to reach the African-American, Latino, and Faith-based communities. We work closely with Nuestro Centro. We have a good relationship with Homeward Bound and will develop presence on the Homeless Coalition. We chair the Prevention Task Force and collaborate with agencies under that umbrella. We are members of NC Coalition Against Sexual Assault, and receive technical assistance for implementation and evaluation of our prevention programs.

The largest difference between our current budget and the proposed year budget is centered on Our VOICE's involvement with the Buncombe County Family Justice Center. Our VOICE, along with other partner agencies, will be moving to the Buncombe County Family Justice Center in July 2016. It is anticipated that all partner agencies will see a dramatic increase in demand for services. The Buncombe County Government has been awarded two grants to support Family Justice Center partner agencies to better respond to the anticipated increased demand. As a result of this funding, Our VOICE will be adding four full-time staff members. Three of the four positions will be starting in the next month while the third position will be starting on July 2016.
