Description of Project

Buncombe County Veterans Treatment Court, the third Veterans Court established in the State of North Carolina and first in Western North Carolina, was inaugurated in January of 2015 and entered its first Veteran participants June 22, 2015. Veterans Treatment Court provides court diversion services to eligible Veterans from the traditional criminal justice system. It provides Vets support and rehabilitation through comprehensive substance abuse and/or mental health treatment while enforcing compliance with treatment protocols via sanctions imposed by the criminal courts. The program provides for vocational rehabilitation, community resource referrals for housing, childcare support, transportation support, and other services, all while being judicially monitored.

Veterans Treatment Court (VTC) is comprised of a collaboration of dedicated partners between the following officials, and agencies: Buncombe County Resident Superior Court Judges, Buncombe County District Attorney's Office, Buncombe County Sheriff's Office, Asheville Veterans Administration, Treatment Accountability for Safer Communities (TASC), RHA Health Services, Inc., Buncombe County Veterans Services, Department of Public Safety Adult Supervision, Western Carolina University and several local community Veterans' service organizations. The target population includes military Veterans charged with felony non-violent criminal offense(s) who are also identified with substance dependency and/or serious mental health issues.

How many people will this project serve?*

The Veterans Treatment Court will serve approximately 25 participants through five phases as participants graduate new participants will be screened and enter VTC. We expect an 80 percent success rate among our participants.

There are Approximately 19000 Veterans in Buncombe County. According to the Veterans Administration: 0.8% American Indian or Alaskan, 26.2% Black or African American, 67.5% White: Ethnicity 93.7% Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino. The average age range is 22-76 years old. The era of service is: Service era (time period including dates served in the military) 7.9% served in Vietnam, 7.1% served in Persian Gulf, 6.3% served in Afghanistan (OEF), 7.1% served in Iraq (OIF), 0.8% served in Iraq (OND), 6.3% served in other military intervention and 16.7% received hostile or friendly fire in a combat zone: Gender 97% male, 3% female.

Veteran income may vary based on discharge, employment and disability rating. Current participants range from \$0.00-\$3,000.00 monthly income.

Geographic area: All of Buncombe County.

Current referrals come from Veterans Administration, Buncombe County Jail services, 28th Judicial Defense Attorneys, and Veteran community groups.

Our current method of tracking data is the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Management Information System that is build on Microsoft Access 2010. The MIS contains basic information such as criminal history, current case information, and information on mental health diagnoses, substance use, employment, education, and housing. It also has the capacity to manage case reports/status updates and all urinalysis result the strengths are that: (1) the MIS is free and one just needs Microsoft Access to use it, (2) it can run some basic reports for users, and (3) the data can be exported to other formats (Excel, SPSS) to do some different analyses.

Strengths and barriers: the strengths are that: (1) the MIS is free and one just needs Microsoft Access to use it, (2) it can run some basic reports for users, and (3) the data can be exported to other formats (Excel, SPSS) to do some different analyses. The barriers: (1) it is not an integrated system with probation, treatment providers, and the rest of the court house, so one or two people will need to track down information from each staff member and put it into the system, rather than having a coordinated MIS; and (2) if a user wanted to add a new variable (like risk level), I would need to email BJA and have them build that into the program.

The VTC attended the NADCP & Justice for Vets conference Washington DC in July 2015 and completed Strategic planning October 14- 16 of 2015
