## **Project Description**

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## Description of Project

Pregnancy is the primary reason high school girls don't finish their education. In 2014, Buncombe County experienced 208 teen pregnancies in girls ages 15-19. The County ranks 61st out of 100 counties in teen pregnancy rates. Women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy are less likely to obtain prenatal care, and their babies are at increased risk of low birth weight and premature birth. These children are more likely to live in poverty and have worse educational, behavioral, and health outcomes than children born to older parents. YW's MotherLove (ML) program provides case management to 30 pregnant and parenting teens, that includes academic goal setting, access to prenatal care and community services, financial management, and parenting skills. ML hosts monthly 'Lunch Bunch' meetings at area schools; topics include pregnancy prevention, parenting skills, college prep, careers, and financial planning. ML Alumni Committee offer support to high school parents through monthly gatherings.

Annually, YW enrolls up to 30 pregnant or parenting teens from nine different schools in Buncombe county. These teens receive one-on-one case management as well as mentors and group education sessions. Additionally, 40 teens are engaged in educational services through Lunch Bunch. This number has reduced because teen pregnancy rates are down, however teen parent graduation rates are not increasing outside of ML. Finally, the ML Alumni Committee consists of 9 members who plan and facilitate gatherings for current ML participants with support from the ML Coordinator.

- 1.) 80% (24/30) of enrolled participants will graduate or advance to the next grade level.
- 2.)100% (30/30) of enrolled participants will be exposed to pregnancy prevention curriculum, and 80% (24/30) will not experience a repeat pregnancy before age 19.
- 3.)100% of enrolled participants (30/30) will access prenatal care and education around healthy pregnancy; 80% (24/30) of births will occur at 37 or more weeks of gestation.

The typical MotherLove participant is a 16-year-old high school student, is eligible for Medicaid, and is experiencing her first unplanned pregnancy. Nearly all of the participants enrolled in MotherLove are experiencing multiple crises: attendance issues, lack of accessible, affordable child care, lack of resources and support, lack of transportation, and inability to cope with the transition to parenting. Many of the young women are non-compliant with prenatal or well baby care. Others have barriers to healthcare such as transportation or ability to pay, or are unable to afford prescribed medications. Many of the young women are in serious conflict with their parent(s) because they are pregnant or parenting.

Referrals to MotherLove are generally from the school, self referral, DSS workers, Buncombe County Health Department staff, and other youth-serving organizations. The current cohort of participants is 23% African American, 41% Latina, 27% White, and 9% Other.

## What key steps will you take to achieve the results of this project?\*

- 1. Case management and one-on-one counseling. Each participant meets with a staff member for at least one hour each month for individual case management.
  - 2. Home Visits to help participants provide healthy, nurturing homes for their children.
- 3. Evening Group Meetings for enrolled participants provide additional opportunities to discuss relevant issues in a supportive, group setting. Evening Group Meetings are coordinated and facilitated by the ML Alumni Committee.
- 4. Monthly Lunch Bunch meetings, held at seven area high schools. Participants are provided with a healthy lunch and receive pregnancy prevention education, information and links to community services, and share stories or seek advice from each other in an atmosphere of inclusion and acceptance. Lunch Bunch is open to any pregnant or parenting teen regardless of enrollment in the MotherLove program.

## Describe the evidence of success that backs this project's approach.\*

What evidence of success (i.e. evidence-based research, practice model, accreditation, industry standards, and/or other framework) are you using as a basis for your project design?

MotherLove utilizes the Positive Parenting Program (Triple P), Partners for a Healthy Baby Curriculum, and the BDI Logic Model provided though the NC Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative (NCTPPI). Triple P is a countywide effort, is recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the WHO, and it is currently used in more than 20 countries and 27 US states. Partners for a Healthy Baby is a nationally recognized, research-based, practice-informed curriculum that strives to improve birth outcomes, reduce rates of child abuse, strengthen families, enhance child developmental outcomes, promote family stability and economic security. The BDI Logic Model was created by NCTPPI based on statewide best practices and is a set of essential activities that lead to delaying a second pregnancy, completion of high school, ensuring healthy births and increasing successful transitions to adulthood including enrollment in post-secondary education, vocational training or employment at a living wage.

MotherLove tracks participant progress through a State database. In this database MotherLove tracks attendance at Lunch Bunch and Group Meetings, as well as contraceptive use, case management meetings and notes, doctor's appointments, bi-annual goal reviews, and program compliance. School and MotherLove staff work closely to make sure participants are getting the academic support needed, are completing the required work, and meeting school attendance requirements. New knowledge and skills are observed through home visits and case management.

The TPPI database works well for tracking attendance, goals, home visits, and notes. However, extracting information for reports, trends, or grant applications isn't possible. We have created a spreadsheet to capture this information and to be used in our quarterly County reports.

Two years ago the YWCA purchased new Daxco software to replace older systems used by various programs. This has greatly streamlined our processes especially in terms of enrollment and billing in our fitness and youth programs. This program is used successfully by several programs, therefore no one person holds all the knowledge reducing risk to the agency overall. We also have a part time IT Coordinator who has an extensive background in systems and is responsible for general support for all IT needs.

We have explored various outcomes tracking software but have not yet found one that meets the various needs of all of our programs. Further, our budget does not allow for such an expense at this time.

The YWCA of Asheville is dedicated to eliminating racism, empowering women, and promoting peace, justice, freedom, and dignity for all. Our mission-driven programs bridge gaps in earning power, education, health and wellness, and child care for low-income and minority members of our community.

In the YWCA strategic plan, passed by the board in May of 2014, the board and staff recommitted to eliminating health disparities that exist in our community along racial and income lines and empowering women. In line with our mission, the long-term impact of MotherLove is to develop healthy women, who are capable and involved parents, and have the education and skills necessary to play a positive role in our economy and society.

# What expertise/accomplishments do you have that are relevant to the proposed project?\*

MotherLove has been a thriving program at the YWCA for 30 years. Based on the results of the participants, there is a direct link between our program and successful completion of high school, the reduction of subsequent adolescent pregnancies, and healthy birth weights.

In the past three years we have enrolled 118 parenting teens who gave birth to 118 healthy babies. Less than 2% of participants have experienced a second teen pregnancy. All but four participants moved on to the next grade level or graduated. Compared with national data, which indicates that only 36% of teen mothers graduate and approximately 30% of adolescent mothers have a subsequent pregnancy, whereas 96% of Mother-Love participants have graduated over the past ten years.

The MotherLove program partners with participants' schools to ensure academic success and with Department of Health and Human Services to help streamline services to participants and to provide family planning. Helpmate, the local domestic violence shelter, provides educational services and also volunteer opportunities that allow students to organize and support the annual Domestic Violence Awareness Vigil. WNC Safe Kids teaches participants about child safety, e.g. SIDS awareness and car seat safety. The state department of Health and Human Services Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program provides support through ongoing training, data collection, funding and best practices. Finally, the MotherLove advisory committee, comprised of community stakeholders and service providers, help the program continue to grow and change to meet the needs of participants.

The submitted budget reflects no significant changes in the current and proposed year. We have secured funding from NCTPPI and United Way of Buncombe County. Funding from the City of Asheville is pending with notification expected in late May.

Unfortunately the agency ended the year in a deficit largely a result of unanticipated cuts by the state legislature to child care vouchers; resulting in a loss in our School Age Program, a program that had previously turned a profit. We are transitioning into a new business model in this program that will allow us to continue serving our target population but reduces costs and decreases our reliance on the voucher subsidy. The losses in this program as well as the adjustments to the expenses made thus far are reflected in the organizational budget which has been trimmed to reflect the loss in revenue.

In accordance to our strategic plan, last year the YWCA raised all employees starting wage from 7.50/hour to 9.00/hour. While we are unable to offer a living wage at this time we do offer generous benefits including 10.5% retirement to everyone who works 1,000 hours/year, a free fitness membership, a 33% discount for our full time child care program.
