## GreenWorks' 2017 Goals

- 1. Engage community volunteers in recycling events and roadside litter and river cleanups;
- 2. Educate county residents, especially children and youth, on the benefits of waste reduction, recycling and composting; and
- 3. Plant shade trees and fruit producing trees in public spaces, including community orchards as part of our Food Tree Project.



# **Countywide Recycling Events**







Hard 2 Recycle: We plan to hold **10 collection events** this year, compared to 5 collections in previous years.

In 2015, we collected >18 Tons of batteries, TVs, toner, books, Styrofoam, cooking oil, cardboard and electronics at five H2R events!

<u>Tire Amnesty Days</u>: In 2015, we collected **3,308 tires** compared to 1,108 the year before. This year we plan to **hold four Tire Amnesty Days**.



## River & Roadside Clean-ups

#### **2015-16 Results**

- 44 River Cleanups
- >100 miles of Road Cleanups
- Tires Collected: 1,444
- Total Trash Removed: 13 tons

#### 2016-17 Goal

 Engage 2,000 volunteers in at least 150 river and roadside cleanup projects.







#### Waste Reduction & Environmental Education





Our original goal stated in our application was to "Provide recycling and composting education to 3,600 students at 25 schools." Since submitting our application, we've exceeded our 2016 goals and are revising our **2017 goal to reach 6,000 students in 30 schools**.



# **Edible & Shade Tree Plantings**



In 2015, GreenWorks **planted 801 trees**, including 56 fruit trees in two new Community Orchards in low-income neighborhoods as part of the Food Tree Project. This year, we plan to **plant 1,000 trees** and install two more Community Orchards.
