Action recommended:

To adjust the budget to reflect additional allocated Federal and State funding for Non Smart-Start Child Care Subsidy funding for FY 2016. This funding represents Federal and State allocations to provide support for Child Care expenses for IV-E eligible children in Buncombe County. The original budgeted amount was based on the State's estimate. In Buncombe County, the Non Smart-Start Child Care Subsidy allocation is \$1,071,658. This allocation represents an increase of \$6,941 over currently budgeted expenditures.

The total amount of Child Care Subsidy (with this additional allocation) for FY16 is \$9,704,006.
