BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Since 1989, Buncombe County has been the designated applicant and recipient of state and federal funding to support the provision of transportation services provided through Mountain Mobility, Buncombe County's Community Transportation System. Mountain Mobility serves senior adults, persons with disabilities, clients of human service agencies, and general public transportation outside of Asheville, as well as transportation services under mandated programs such as Medicaid and the City of Asheville/ART's ADA Comparable Paratransit Program. Mountain Mobility is administered under a contract with the Land-of-Sky Regional Council and is operated under a contract with McDonald Transit Associates.

The public hearing and resolutions authorizing the submission of applications are required as a part of the FY 2018 grant applications to the NCDOT for administrative and capital grant funding for Mountain Mobility. A summary of FY 2018 grant funding requests is provided.

As a new item in this year's application process, the NCDOT is requiring all counties to adopt a resolution designating the applicant for federal and state funding for the next five years. The County may either designate itself or may, at its discretion, designate another qualified entity. The designated applicant must have the technical and financial capacity necessary to apply for, administer, operate, carry out the transportation projects, and comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, and guidelines. Staff recommends that the Board re-designate Buncombe County as the designated applicant and recipient of all state and federal funds received through the NCDOT for the administration, operations, and capital needs of Mountain Mobility.

Notices of the public hearing and the opportunity to comment on transportation needs and the proposed grant applications were published in the Asheville Citizen-Times newspaper, posted on Buncombe County's web site, and were distributed to various organizations and groups that may have an interest in services provided.

Requires significant program monitoring and oversight by Buncombe County staff to ensure that federal/state funds are used for the intended purpose, including financial administration and oversight, maintenance documentation, vehicle inspections, site visits to contractors and agencies, compliance documentation for employee selection, driver training, safety and security, etc.

ALTERNATIVES:

Currently there are no alternatives for administrative funds available under this program. There are limited alternatives to capital grant funds available; however, match requirements are usually higher under other alternatives.

ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Hold public hearing and consider adoption of the three resolutions required as a part of the grant applications.
