Background information

The Nurse-Family-Partnership (NFP) is an effective, evidence-based approach to improving the health and life-course of first-time, low-income mothers and their children. In its 30-year history, NFP has shown substantial and consistent results related to improved child and maternal health, child abuse and neglect reduction, crime reduction and school readiness. In Buncombe County for the year 2012, there were 524 first-time low-income women who were eligible for and could benefit from the program.

The additional funds with be used to purchase educational supplies for clients and trainings for NFP staff.

- Linkage across Health & Human
 Services in order to improve the lives
 of first time mothers and their children
- Evidence based approach that has shown a decrease in reported incidents of child abuse & neglect
- Better health outcomes for newborns

Funds required

No county funds are required.

Alternatives

This nurse-based program provides an opportunity to partner across Human Services agencies in order to coordinate service delivery, improve the health of infants and children, and reduce incidents of child abuse and neglect. Satisfactory alternatives have not proven to produce the same results for children and families.

Action recommended:

Increase Nurse Family Partnership budget by \$18,556 to reflect additional federal funding.
