Description of Project

Sandy Mush Community Center (SMCC) requests funds to continue the restoration and preservation of our historic community center building which serves as the center of community engagement and access to services in our rural community. Sandy Mush is located in the most rural area of Buncombe county, a 45 minute drive to Asheville and a 20 minute drive to the nearest library, public school, and public internet service. The community is a leader in farmland preservation and sustainable local agriculture through conservation easements and market endeavors such as the new Farm Heritage Trail.

The historic Sandy Mush School built in 1927 has served as the only center of recreational activities for the 550 households in Sandy Mush for over 40 years. A new Board was elected in November, 2015, to build the center's capacity to serve the community and great progress was made on programming in 2016.

We are proud of our historic building and its reuse supports the preservation goals of the Buncombe County Sustainability Plan. The building is in need of repairs to keep its use energy efficient. Several windows are broken and most need glazing as well as screen repair and replacement. Plaster repair is needed for all classrooms where activities and meetings take place. At present, the classrooms do not have individual heating units requiring the heating of the full building to utilize one room in the winter months. Repairs on stairway handrails, broken glass in interior doors, and sanding of two classroom floors that are splintering are needed to improve safety.

Sandy Mush Community Center is requesting funds to cover the repairs of this historic building and to make its use more energy efficient with zone heating in the classrooms and screens for summer cooling. This project will stabilize our community center building, reduce energy and financial waste for its operation, and allow our limited funds to be focused on programming for the community.

The Sandy Mush Community Center serves 550 families with a population of 1,515. All households receive information about programming at the community center and benefit from some of the activities such as community beautification. During the past year of revitalization of the community center, an estimated 40% of families participated in some of the programming offered by the center.

The area families are predominately white and Latino with a median income below \$42,000 per year. The community center reaches the households with a regular permission based email newsletter that goes to over 100 households, the community center sign board, and a print newsletter delivered to every household in Little and Big Sandy Mush through the postal service's EDDM mailing service. In addition, word of mouth, announcements at area churches, and organizational events and posters at area businesses promote activities to the community.

What key steps will you take to achieve the results of this project?*

The Sandy Mush Community Center Building Team has been in discussion with the Center Board and area businesses to assess the repair needs of the center in order to create the budget for this project. All work will be completed within three months of contracting services. The repairs and upgrades will be completed in full by November 17, 2017.

Sandy Mush Community Center retains records of propane use through regular checks on the tank's meter and electric use through review of the monthly bills from French Broad Electric Coop. The use of the center building has increased every month since the reorganization in November, 2015, resulting in an increase in energy use. This trend is expected to continue in the winter and summer, 2017. The Board will compare and analyze energy use records after repairs, the installation of screens, and the installation of zone heating, anticipating a savings from these improvements.

All quotes and final work will be documented in the Sandy Mush Community Center minutes, including photos. Energy use records will be charted and compared to the prior year based on use and weather. Excel spreadsheet will be used to aid in the review of progress toward reduced energy use.

The Sandy Mush community has no access to Internet in our community center and very limited access throughout our area. This is an ongoing problem for families, agricultural businesses in the area, and students. The closest public broadband is a 20-minute drive away at Leicester Library whose computers receive heavy use. The community center is making plans to connect to a new fiber optic line recently installed near the center to make the inside and immediate outside of the center a hotspot for use by area residents, especially students. We are working with AT&T who has expressed a willingness to cover the cost of bringing Internet from the fiber optic line to the center building. Buncombe County is discussing a reduced rate for our community center with AT&T.

The Sandy Mush Community Center is organized exclusively for charitable purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The purpose of the organization is community improvement and capacity building through goals including, but not limited to:

- Strengthen the sense of community and awareness of community history and its agricultural heritage
- Increase educational and health and wellness opportunities
- Increase preservation efforts, including the historic Sandy Mush School and grounds
- Strengthen and support community organizations

This project will stabilize and preserve our community center building, reduce energy and financial waste for its operation, and allow our limited funds to be focused on programming goals stated above in cooperation with area organizations.

What expertise/accomplishments do you have that are relevant to the proposed project?*

In accordance with the Buncombe County Sustainability Plan, recreational opportunities were increased in 2016 through a series of new programs and partnerships. The center sponsored free events including an Earth Day celebration in partnership with the local 4-H chapter, a July 4th celebration, a Halloween Trunk or Treat with the Fire Department, and regular covered dish gatherings. The community center library was reopened and an oral history project began to interview former students of the school. Regular classes were

held focusing on health such as yoga and clogging. Volunteer teams carried out trash pick-ups in the community and beautification of the building and grounds at the center.

In 2017, we will expand classes, community gatherings, and also work with the Buncombe County Bookmobile to add programming for young children. We are researching serving as a food pantry and working to bring broadband Internet to our community center for use by area students and families.
