

Child Care Subsidy & Smart Start

- An average of 1,793 children received Child Care Subsidy from July 2016 to March 2017, which represents our latest data.
- ❖ 224 children receive Smart Start. This equates to 12% of children receiving Child Care Subsidy are receiving Smart Start.





GS 110-106 refers to religious sponsored child care facilities that are issued a Notice of Compliance rather than a Star rating. They are allowed to be exempt from meeting some of the child care requirements.
