Read To Succeed (R2S) serves students in 5 Asheville City Elementary Schools (ACS) and currently 3 Buncombe County Elementary Schools (BCS) (Johnston, Candler and Estes). This grant, if awarded, will enable R2S to expand our early literacy program into 3 additional Buncombe schools during the 2018-2019 academic year.

R2S was founded by citizens concerned with the alarmingly high achievement gap in public schools. Our mission: To support public elementary schools in reducing the literacy achievement gap. R2S has two goals: (1) To enable low-income students, grades K through 3rd, to gain in reading skill so to reach reading proficiency by the end of 3rd grade, and, (2) To partner with the community to support students' academic growth as well as community participation in efforts to improve the quality of public education.

We are proud of these accomplishments:

Quality Education--increase percentage of children reading at grade level by end of 3rd grade Community--increase volunteerism in Buncombe County

Shared Vision*

What critical community problem or challenge are you hoping to improve through this project?

R2S directly addresses the county's education goal: To enable students who are challenged by reading to achieve reading level by 3rd grade. The need for R2S's program is crystal clear: Of the 114 school districts in NC, our districts have the biggest achievement gap. Fewer than 50% black and low-income 3rd graders achieve proficiency by 3rd grade (www.dpi.state.nc.us).

Reading is a crucial foundation skill for a successful life. Students leaving 3rd grade below level in reading are up to 4 times more likely to drop out than their peers, and 10 times more likely if they are black. Lack of education will lead to less employment and income as well as increased rates of other social ills (Annie E. Casey Foundation, 2016).

Key Steps*

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How will the project work? What are specific activities and milestones that your project entails?

If awarded, Buncombe County Strategic funds will be used to strengthen the R2S infrastructure, grow the organization, maintain the high quality of our program, and expand the number of Buncombe elementary schools that we serve from 3 to 6. (We currently have volunteer tutors at Johnston, Candler and Estes Schools.) We will definitely serve Haw Creek elementary and would be able to add two more schools. The cost

of training our volunteers is the largest single expense to the R2S program and is the reason we can maintain a high-quality program.

Key steps in entering a new school:

- *planning-meeting with principals and school staff
- *recruiting volunteers
- *training volunteer coaches & buddies—prep and training
- *matching volunteers and students
- *supervision 1st year

The program cost of entering a new school is approximately \$10,00 for the first year because of the necessary planning time. The cost per school in future years is lower and will vary depending on number of students served.

People Served*

R2S serves students in K-3rd referred to our program by school principals or by his/her designees. In 2016-2017 we served 134 students, including 98 who completed their grade and 36 who left R2S because they moved or were transferred to another program

All R2S students are on free/reduced lunch and approximately 40% live in public housing. Currently, 85% of students are in Asheville schools but that percentage will change as we expand to Buncombe schools.

Partners*

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Which other organizations are you working with to reach your goals? What other local organizations provide similar services or serve similar beneficiaries, and how do you work together?

R2S has collaborative relationships with many organizations:

*Asheville Housing Authority (AHA) provides us with office and meeting space as well as opportunities to provide summer programs for AHA children.

*We have cross referral arrangements with the Literacy County, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, and OpenDoors (with whom we are developing a "continuum of care").

*We have collaborative relationships with Children First, public libraries, Smart Start, YWCA, and UNCA Women's basketball team (whose players serve as reading buddies in the Pre-K program at Isaac Dickson).

Several other programs work with students in K-12th by providing homework help in after-school hours. However, R2S is the only volunteer organization that matches tutors who (1) are highly trained in a research-based muti-sensory phonics approach, (2) work in-school with only K-3rd graders, and, (3) make

commitments to continue working with their students until they reach grade level in reading or they complete 3rd grade.

Personnel*

Who is responsible for the project? Briefly describe project leaders and the role each will play in the project. How do these leaders reflect the population or community that you serve?

Ann Flynn is the Exec. Dir. of R2S and, along with the 11 member working board, is responsible for the overall successful operations of the organization. Ann is a proven leader with 30+ years in nonprofit leadership and development. Julie Thomas, Program and Training Dir., and Michele Luther, Program Coordinator, both have strong backgrounds in tutor training and elementary classroom teaching. Julie has trained in the Orton-Gillingham Multisensory Language Arts Education and Wilson Reading System and 30 years of working with children who have educational delays in reading. Both of these staff focus full time on tutor training, supervision, support of our volunteer tutors, and curricula development. Board receives program and financial reports monthly and reviews staff performance once a year. 14% of our board, staff and volunteers are people of color. We honor the differences and dignity of the community we serve, and we pledge to create and maintain an environment of respect of all.

Success*

R2S has a rigorous system of measuring results. With parental permission, schools share students' teacher-administered standardized test results (mClass 3 times a year and End-of-Grade at end of 3rd). In addition, our own assessment system is completed by our tutors three times a year. Both data sets are analyzed by our program evaluator and success is determined by the number of our students who reach grade level in reading.

The impact of the R2S program is assessed by two methods. R2S staff meet with school principals several times a year to obtain their views on the effectiveness of the program. In addition, classroom teachers are surveyed each year for ideas on improvements and the overall impact of our program. The analysis of both data sets are included in our annual report.

R2S board and staff work from a logic model that is reviewed at the end of each school year during our annual retreat and adjusted for the next year if necessary. It is available upon request.

Funding*

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What is your plan for finding the balance of the project budget? What is your funding timeline and what are your other sources of support?

The R2S board has an outstanding record of finding financial support for our organization; ex., our budget the 1st year was \$6,000; last year it was \$87,724. We fund our budget with a balance of funds from private, corporate and government sources. Currently, a partial list of funding sources includes, but is not limited to, foundation grants such as the Max & Victoria Dyrfus Fund, City of Asheville Strategic Partnership grant, United Way, Rotary, area churches and 3rd party fundraisers held on our behalf. Our budget's overall income

breakdown is individual donor contributions (42%), grants (33%), student sponsorships (10%), plus other sources including fundraisers (5%) and miscellaneous sources (5%). We are already on budget for our FY19 income goal of \$138,500. This FY19 budget is a significant increase but will be necessary if we are to serve more Buncombe County Schools.

Sustainability*

How will this project be maintained? Please describe funding sources and how you plan to sustain the project in future years.

R2S board and staff are working hard to increase all funding streamsincluding grants, corporate sponsorships and individual donors. In the first 6 months of FY 17-18, individual contributions are up by 42% over FY 16/17 (\$35,916 to \$50,000) and we have implemented a popular coach-student sponsorship which is bringing in new donors. 100% of board members donate to R2S and we are provided free office space in the Pisgah View housing community. We have recently worked with WNC Nonprofit Pathways to identify strategic organizational needs and we are putting in place a strong fund development, marketing and outreach plan. We have over 130 highly trained/motivated volunteers who are committed to decreasing the achievement gap. R2S has a strong working board, diverse funding streams, committed experienced staff and internal systems in place to support smooth operations. The Board and staff are dedicated to ensuring the long term financial health of the organization.
