**CCAP Project at Leicester Community**

The Leicester Community Center worked with the Soil and Water Conservation District to do a stream bank protection project in the fall of 2016. The stream banks on the property were eroding and undermining several large trees that lined the stream. A gully had formed where surface runoff from the street and playground areas entered the stream. The District worked with Division of Soil and Water Conservation engineer Jeff Young to develop a design for sloping and stabilizing the banks and installing a drop box and pipe to control the gully erosion. The project was completed in late fall with the exception of five rows of live stakes that will be installed in February of 2017. The live stakes will sprout and the small shrubs such of silky willow and silky dogwood will provide shade to the stream and the roots will help stabilize the streambanks. Thanks to Greg Brookshire and the Community Center for their help on a good project that will help protect water quality in the Newfound Creek Watershed!

## **Drill Available for Spring Planting**

The drought conditions of the summer of 2016 may have resulted in some loss of stand in pastures or hayfields. If this is the case, over seeding may be beneficial to insure a vigorous stand of desirable grass species. The Buncombe SWCD has a no-till seed drill that can be used to drill grass seed into existing stands. It is available for rental with a minimum rate of \$50/day or \$10/acre and can easily be transported to your farm with a pickup and requires about a 50 horsepower tractor with remote hydraulics for operation.
