- WHEREAS, Stroke is the fourth leading cause of death in the United States and the number one leading cause of adult disability striking over 795,000 Americans each year; and
- WHEREAS, Stroke costs this country more than \$72 billion annually in medical treatment and lost productivity, but far more regrettable is the immeasurable suffering it brings to victims and their families; and
- WHEREAS, Stroke can often be avoided by controlling its risk factors and paying attention to stroke's warning signals which can prevent serious damage to a victim's health and may even save a life; however, very few people know how to recognize a stroke or what to do if someone is having one; and
- WHEREAS, because so many of the risk factors for stroke can be minimized by personal effort, public awareness is the key weapon in conquering stroke; and
- WHEREAS, Buncombe County Emergency Management Services and Mission Hospitals are working to help educate our citizens about stroke prevention and the ways to identify signs of stroke and are promoting "Go Gray in May Because Gray Matter Matters Campaign"; and
- WHEREAS, to encourage citizen awareness of stroke, this Board has been asked to proclaim May as Stroke Awareness Month.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED** by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Buncombe as follows:
