## **NEW BUSINESS**

• Mountain Valley Resource, Conservation and Development Council Report

Jessica Hocz with the Mountain Valley Resource Conservation and Development Council, gave an update on the programs and projects that the Council was working on across their 8 county region. She reviewed the project called Raising Cane that involved the planting and restoration of river cane around Owen Middle School. Other projects involve the Barnardsville Elementary School and a septic tank overflow problem that was solved with the creation of rain gardens made possible with grant funding. The main project in Buncombe involved the Ivy River and improved water quality in the watershed for the Weaverville area. Vice Chair Frost suggested that they document the impact of their efforts to improve economic and sustainable value in the region.

In response to the Chairman's questions, Mr. Hocz said that she would review the possibility of including one of the large tracts of river cane on the Hominy Creek below the new elementary school as a part of the Raising Cane project. Ms. Hocz said that there was a vacancy on the RC&D Council and asked the Board to fill the vacancy.
