Quarter 1	"The Respite Scholarship Program provided stipends for families of children with emotional, behavioral, and/or medical health issues or families impacted by risk factors. We were able to support 13 families and 28 children during this first quarter to help pay for childcare.
	These funds were used to obtain quality respite services for their children. Respite care provided temporary relief for parents and was shown through our satisfaction surveys to reinforce behavioral and developmental skills, reduce out-of-home placements, and decrease negative behaviors. Parnets had some time away from their kiddos for self-care, making them better parents. Parents were responsible for choosing and hiring their own Respite Provider(s). Respite providers worked directly for parents to provide safe, structured, and developmentally appropriate experiences for your children. In addition, parents provided orientation, supervision, and any necessary on-the-job training specific to the individualized needs of their child. Sctipends allowed parents to hire a Respite Provider directly. It was up to the parents to arrange for what made sense in their lives and was most helpful. The family decided when they wanted someone to watch their kiddo and how much to pay them. "
