Representatives from each agency have been informed about the services offered through the Council on Aging and Weatherization programs. Along with informing those households about the CIP and LIEAP programs, these agencies will make referrals to the Council on Aging or the Community Action Opportunities Weatherization program as needed.

Energy Neighbor, Share the Warmth, Wake Electric Round Up, and Helping Each Member Cope funds are not governed by this Plan.
