

FY2014 COST SHARE HIGHLIGHTS

North Carolina Agriculture Cost Share Program Planned:

Regular Cost Share Program Contracts – 6 developed (\$65,597)

29.8 acres of Cropland Conversion; 1 grassed waterway; 1 well; 850 linear feet of livestock exclusion fencing; 11 livestock watering tanks; 11 heavy use area protection; 1 stream pickup; 1 spring development; 7,603 linear feet of pipeline.

CROWD FUNDING PILOT PROJECT

The Buncombe SWCD is cooperating with the N. C. Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts and the N. C. Foundation for Soil and Water



Conservation on a pilot project to determine if crowd funding could be used to raise funds for specific educational or environmental projects. Soil and Water Conservation Districts in North Carolina utilize social media to some extent for outreach, but have not used it to raise funds for specific projects. The District has decided that an outdoor classroom will work well for the pilot and is working with Cane Creek Middle School on a project that will make improvements to the site the school uses for Creek Week. During Creek Week, seventh and eighth grade students go down to Cane Creek and do various studies in the stream and learn about aquatic species and protecting water quality. This project will provide a safe access point to Cane Creek, a deck for conducting classes, walks to the site, and invasive species removal along the stream. All the improvements will be handicap accessible and will provide a better learning environment for Cane Creek Middle School students.


