FJC Intake Statistics

In our first three years **1,707** Integrated Intakes were provided at the FJC.

In FY 19, **690** people accessed integrated intake services for the first time at the FJC, a 15% increase over FY 18.

In FY19, **51%** of survivors accessed more than one provider on their first visit to the FJC.



- **84%** identified domestic violence as the primary victimization
- **14%** identified sexual assault or stalking as the primary victimization

FJC Successes & Advancements

Intake Survey Data:

- **92%** of survey respondents had a plan to keep themselves safe and they knew what to do if they were in danger after FJC Intake.
- **69%** of survey respondents reported a decreased fear and anxiety level.



State and National Recognition:

- GCC developed a dedicated funding category for FJCs and continues to refer to us as a leader in the state.
- BC FJC was featured at the October National FJC Directors Call for their **Survivor-Focused Practices**.

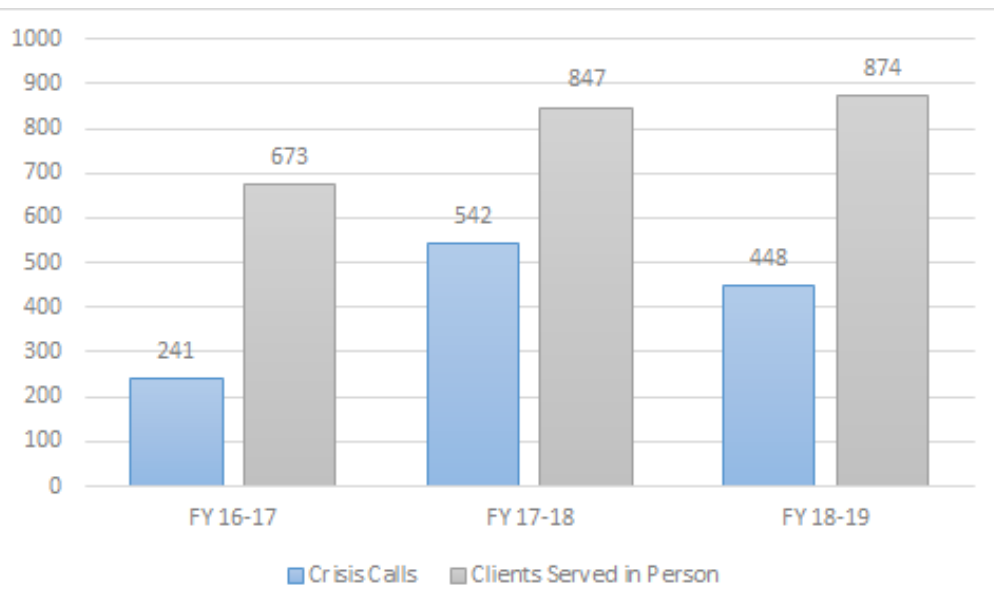
FJC Future Focuses & Opportunities

 - Identifying long-term priorities and enhancement opportunities.

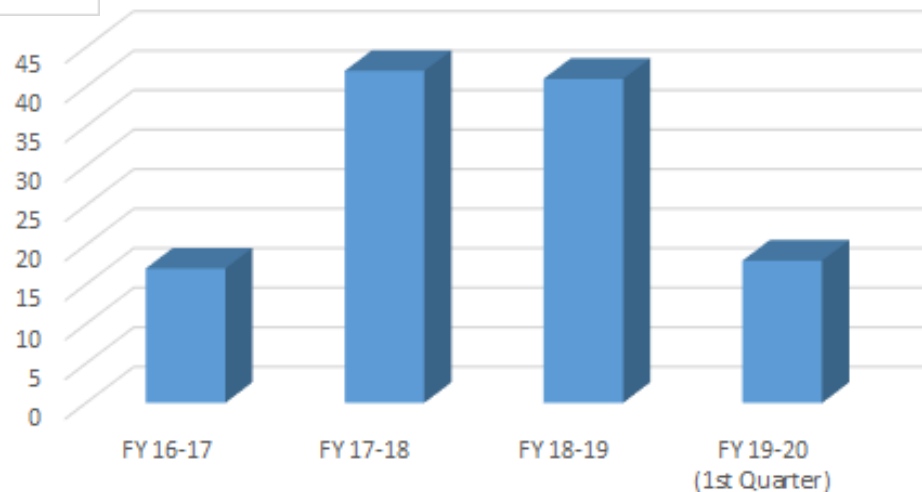

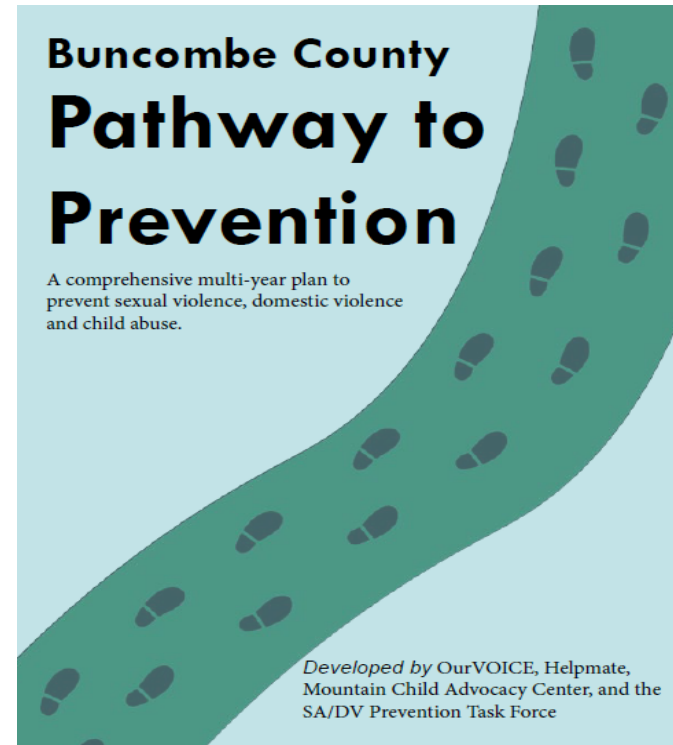

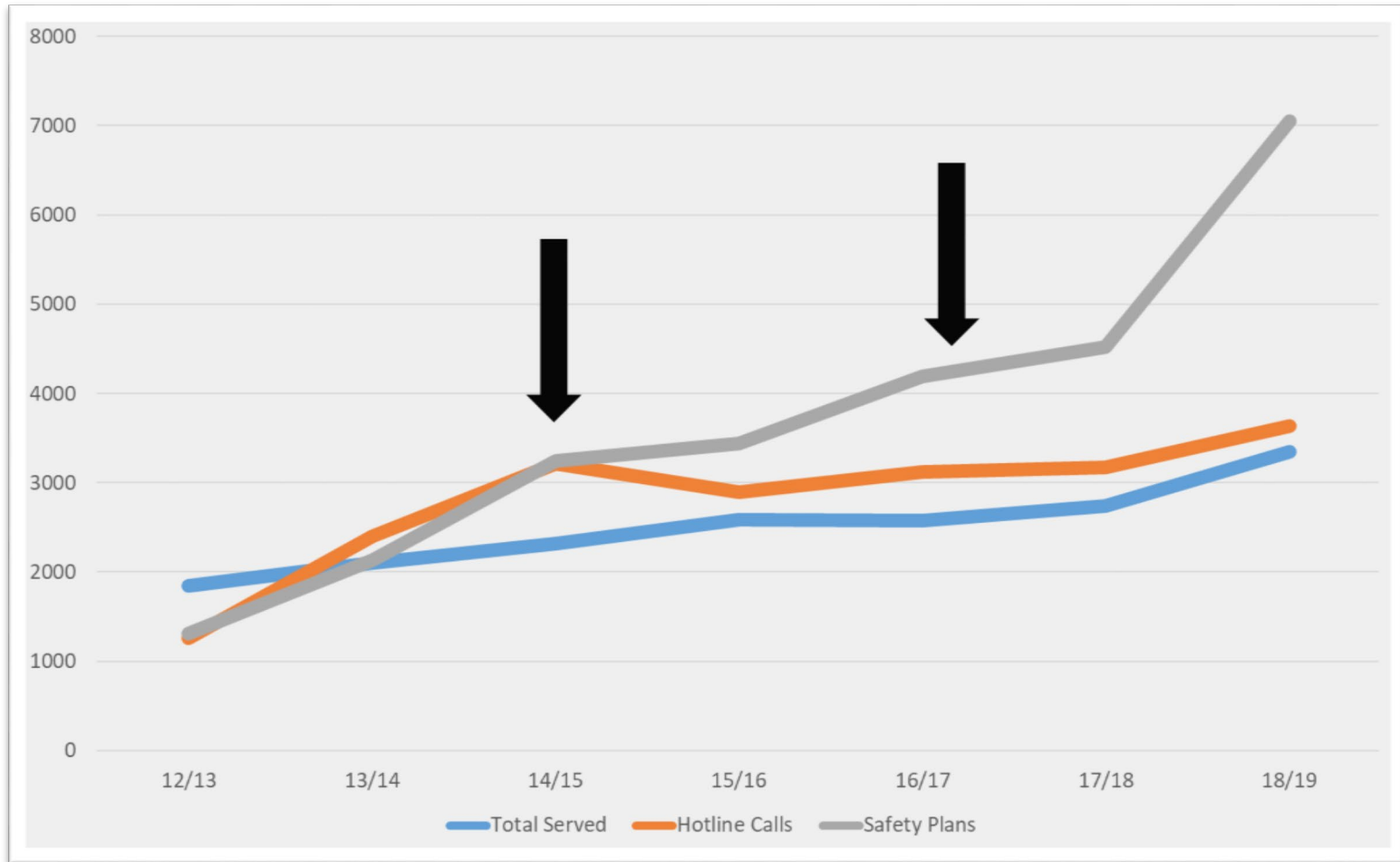
