




At June 30, 2019, the Authority's assets exceeded liabilities by






Crisis response + AVL Forward

- Air service nearly ceased for about 8 weeks
- Slight up-tick happening
- Predicted recovery up to 4 years

Asheville airport to receive over \$14 million in federal aid

ASHEVILLE, N.C. (WLOS) — More than 70 airports in North Carolina, including the Asheville Regional Airport, will split nearly \$284 million in federal aid.

U.S. Secretary of Transportation Elaine L. Chao announced the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Airport Grant Program this week in an effort to provide immediate relief to American families, workers and businesses.














TERMINAL TRANSFORMATION
