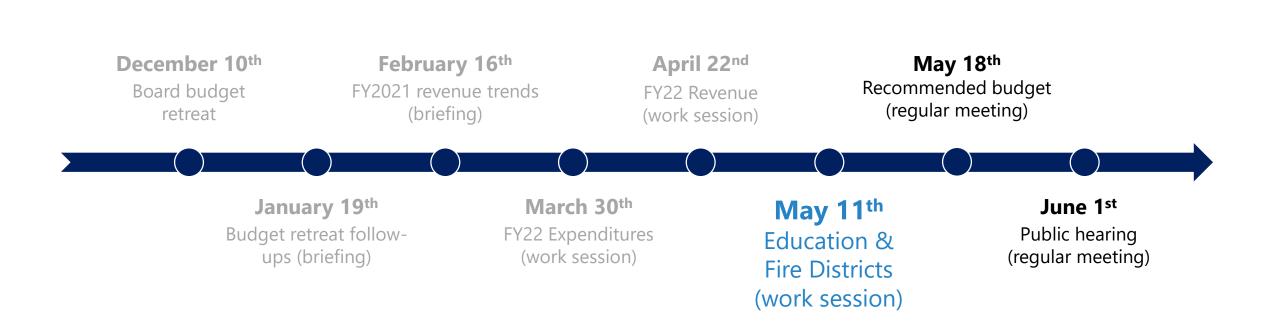

Fire District Tax Rates



FY2022 Fire District Tax Rate Requests

- 8 districts maintaining revenue neutral tax rate
- 12 districts requesting tax rates above revenue neutral tax rate
- Primary budget drivers include:
 - Salary & benefit increases: new positions, wage increases, potential state retirement contributions
 - New stations, repairs and maintenance to current facilities
 - Vehicle & equipment replacement

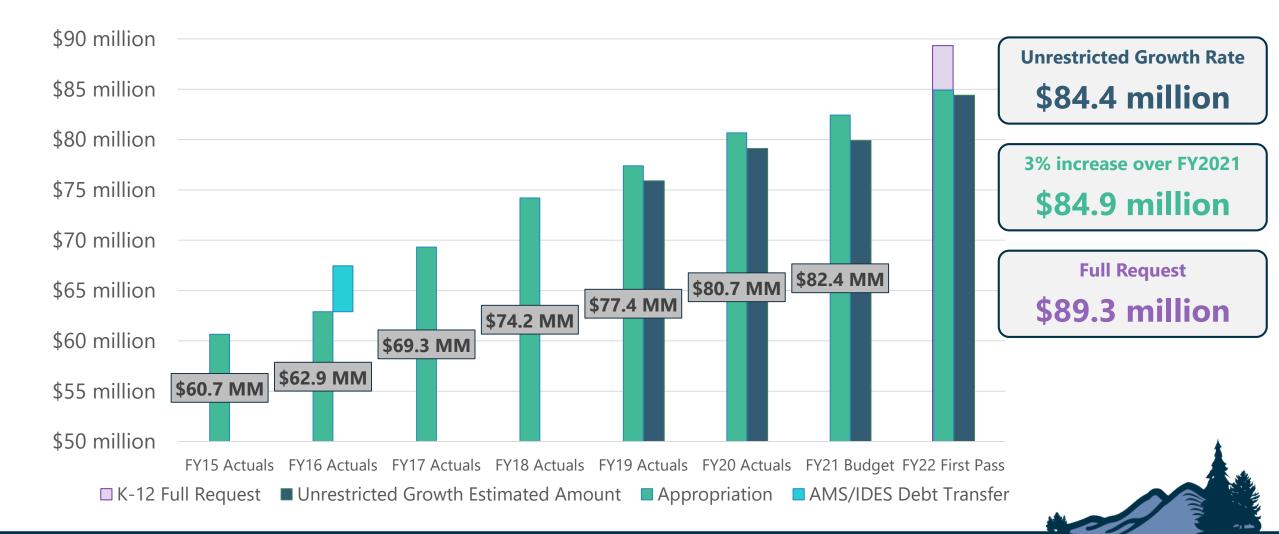

Local funding for Asheville City Schools comes from two sources:

- 1. Local current expense
- 2. Supplemental tax

In FY2020, ACS ranked **2nd highest in NC** in terms of local funding per pupil.
