#### A-B Tech Board of Trustees

Dr. John Gossett, A-B Tech President, provided an update to the commissioners on the activities and accomplishments of the agency. Appreciation of the partnership with the County was expressed.

#### Mountain Community Capital Fund

Lynn Smith, Board Chair, provided an update and explained the purpose of the committee is to provide loans to small business owners whose main weakness is lack of collateral. The committee's accomplishments, finances, and impact were highlighted.

#### Juneteenth - Additional County Holiday

Sharon Burke, Human Resources Director, explained that requests and suggestions were made to consider adding the Juneteenth holiday. The Buncombe County Equity & Inclusion workgroup researched the holiday and found that it was in alignment with the Buncombe County Strategic Plan. The holiday would be observed the Friday on or before June 19th as a County-paid holiday annually.

#### Adoption of 160D – BC Code of Ordinances Integration

Nathan Pennington, Planning Director, and Brandon Freeman, County Attorney, explained that Chapter 160D ("160D") is the culmination of years of work to significantly recodify and modernize city and county development regulations (enabling legislation).

# • Brown Rezoning Request

The property would move from R-1 Residential to R-LD Low-Density Residential at the address of 7 Chalmers Way in Swannanoa. The total acreage of the property is 4.59.

# • Letter of Commitment for Public Financing of Mountain Housing Opportunities Low-Income Housing Tax Credit Program Project Application

Matt Cable, Planning Manager, summarized the project proposals and funding requests for the FY22 Affordable Housing Services Program that Mountain Housing Opportunities (MHO) submitted for Lakeshore Villas and Pentland Place.

Vice Chair Whitesides moved to authorize staff and the Chairman to negotiate project loan terms and send Letters of Commitment for \$800,000 in funding to support the two Mountain Housing Opportunities LIHTC Program applications to the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency. Commissioner Edwards seconded and the motion passed 6-0.

Jennifer Barnette, Budget Director, explained the budget amendment.
