### Advancing our Strategic Plan: Highlights

#### Educated & Capable Community

- **\$104.9 million** for education partners (10.9% increase for K-12 and AB Tech)
- \$3.82 million for Early Childhood Education & Development Fund
- \$154,788 investment in Arts and Culture Grants & Museum of Science
- **\$73,116** to continue internet access programs

#### **Environmental & Energy Stewardship**

- **\$4 million** for Solar Projects
- \$1.6 million for alternatively fueled vehicles
- **\$750,000** for conservation easements
- **\$175,000** for low-income citizen energy efficient projects (Blue Horizons)
- **\$120,000** for Electric Vehicle charging infrastructure
- **\$75,000** for Battery Storage Pilot Program

#### Resident Well-Being

- **\$564,146** investment in recreation assets
- **\$326,055** additional County investment in Community Paramedicine program
- \$125,000 for an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) assessment

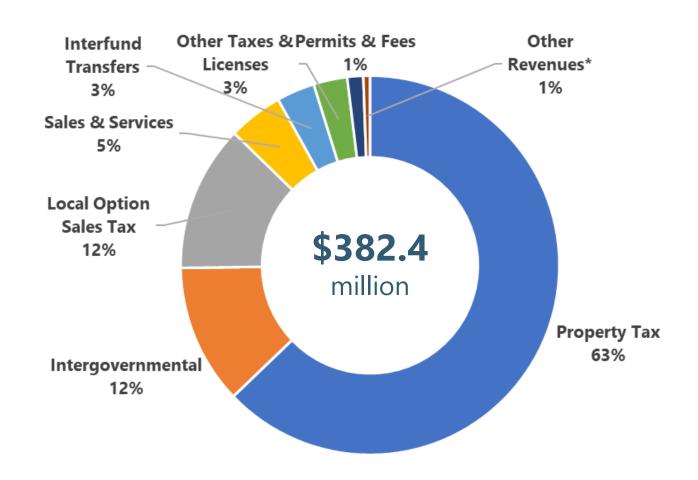

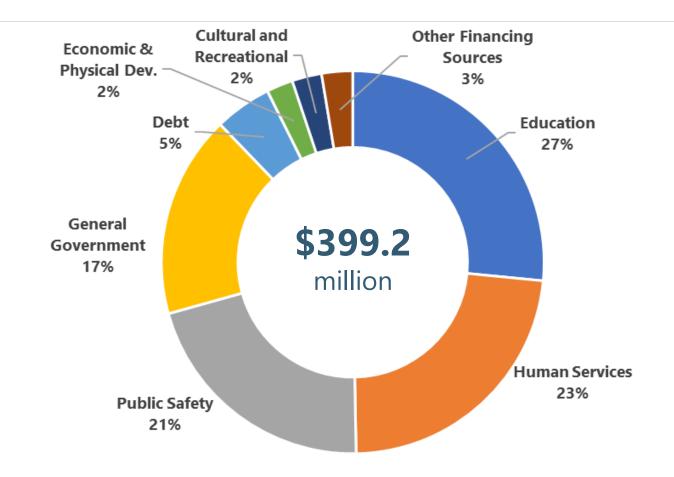
