Advance Planning

- Began, in earnest, August 2022
- Representatives from:
 - Buncombe County
 - City of Asheville
 - Law Enforcement (Sheriff's Department and Asheville Police Department)
 - HIAC
 - Homeless Coalition
 - Community Paramedics
 - Providers (ABCCM, Salvation Army, Rescue Mission, BeLoved)
 - Mission Hospital
 - ART





Code Purple Plan

- Code Purple Locations:
 - ABCCM:
 - Veteran's Restoration Quarters: Single Men: 50
 - Transformation Village: Women/Children: 50
 - Hotel Space: Families: 5 available as needed
- Winter Shelter: ongoing 24/7 emergency shelter
 - ABCCM: (starting in November)
 - Costello House: Single Men (enrolled in program): 30
 - Asheville Ecumenical Winter Shelter (starting in December)
 - 10 beds rotating between 4 churches





Code Purple Plan

- Operating October 15, 2022-April 30, 2023
 - Called on nights when temperatures are forecast of 32 degree or below (48 hours in advance)
 - Called by Homeless Coalition Chairs
- Entry time 8pm:
 - Late entries accepted from hospital, law enforcement community paramedics, ABCCM/BeLoved Outreach
- Exit time: 7:30am
- Transportation provided at no cost
 - ART (night before and morning after)
 - ABCCM Shuttles

• Community Paramedics, as appropriate



Code Purple Funding

- Buncombe County Government \$50,000
- City of Asheville: \$50,000
- City of Asheville released an RFP
 - Requests received from 3 providers
 - HIAC finance committee reviewed
 - Brought recommendations to HIAC on 10/28
 - Committee approved recommendations
 - City of Asheville staff will execute contracts

 - Medical clearance
- Key takeaways
 - More Code Purple beds than last year (105 vs 78)
 - Code Purple Manual to be released by Homeless Coalition soon
- Coordinating team will continue to meet and evaluate the plan
- Upcoming report from National Alliance to End Homelessness on unsheltered homelessness
