# COVID Recovery Funding

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Federal aid to state & local governments
- Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds
  - Direct, flexible funding from U.S. Treasury
  - Funds to invest toward recovery from COVID-19 and its negative economic impacts
- **Buncombe County allocation: \$50.7 Million**



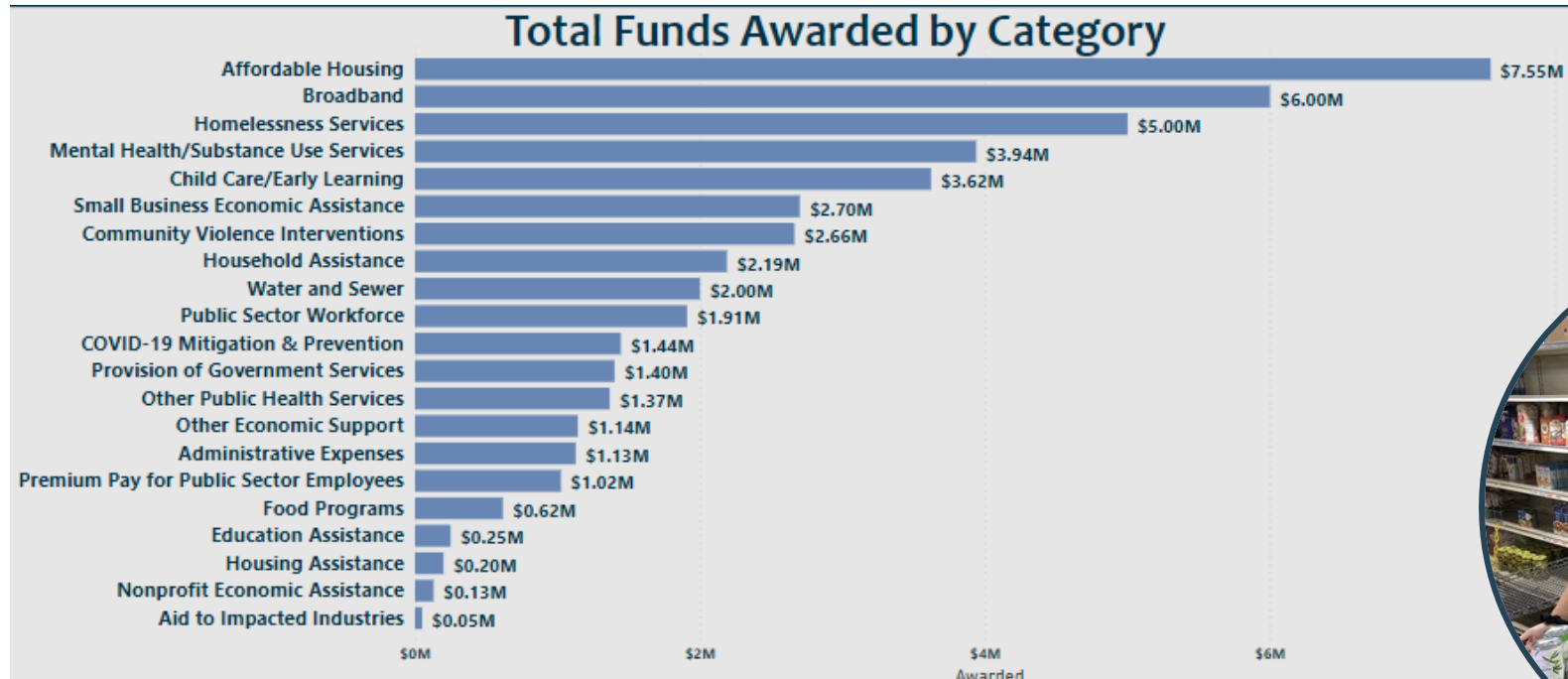


# Rolling Awards to Date

# Current Project Breakdown

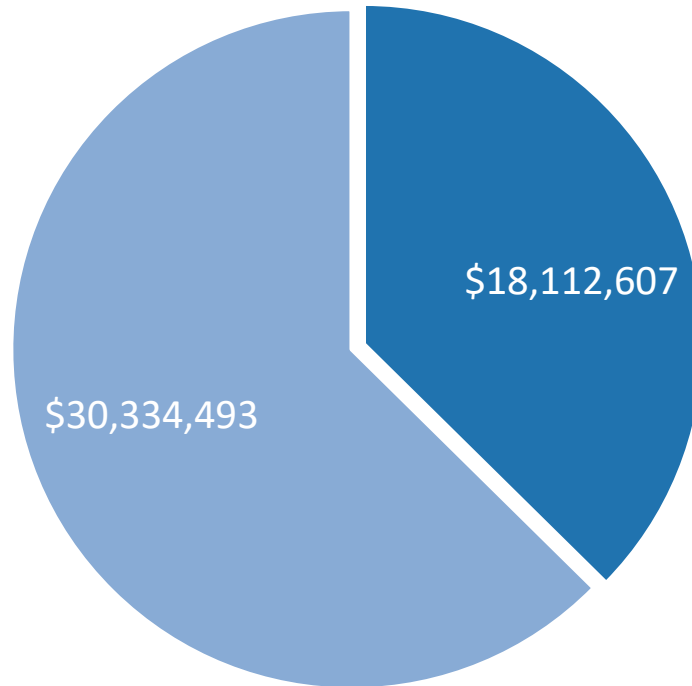
## Allocation of Funds

### ■ Community Partner Led Projects

- 35 Total Projects
- 23% of Projects completed
- 63% of allocated funds

### ■ County Department Led Projects

- 14 Total Projects
- 43% of Projects completed
- 37% of allocated funds

# Proposed Allocations

- COVID Contingency:  
Reduce by \$1,013,116 and close the project

- Broadband Infrastructure Expansion:  
Reduce by \$1,500,000

+ Ferry Road Infrastructure:  
Increase by \$2,264,716

+ Homelessness Initiative Advisory Committee (HIAC) Shelter Support  
New project for \$875,000

+ Housing/Shelter  
New project for \$3,800,000

Reducing these projects will increase the amount available that can be allocated to new projects to **\$6,939,716**

Proposed increases/allocations to these 3 projects total **\$6,939,716** which will fully allocate all available COVID Recovery Funding





# Interlocal Agreement

- The Homeless Initiative Advisory Committee (HIAC) Shelter Support \$875,000 is part of an overall \$1.75 M request from HIAC to:
  - Buncombe County
  - The City of Asheville
- The City of Asheville is willing to administer the funds by establishing and monitoring contracts with shelter providers selected by HIAC:
  - The Salvation Army of Asheville & Buncombe County
  - Safe Shelter (fiscal agent = Grace Episcopal Church)
  - Haywood Street Congregation
- The draft interlocal agreement establishes the terms for the funding, including regular performance reporting



# Requests for Board Action

## 1. Consider approval of changes to COVID Recovery Funding awards as listed:

- Reduce COVID Contingency by \$1,013,116
- Reduce Broadband Infrastructure Expansion by \$1,500,000
- Increase Ferry Road Infrastructure by \$2,264,716
- Establish new projects:
  - HIAC Shelter Support \$875,000
  - Housing/Shelter \$3,800,000
