NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Cor	mmissioners for the County of Buncombe as follows:	
WHEREAS,	the Board of Commissioners supports the formal amendment of this Mountain Mobility Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy to assure worker fitness and to protect employees and the public from the risks posed by the use of prohibited drugs and the misuse of alcohol.		
WHEREAS,	the North Carolina Department of Transportation Integrated Mobility Division requires transit systems to revise policies to ensure compliance at the local level; and		
WHEREAS,	Buncombe County adopted a Substance Abuse Policy by Resolution 95-11-11 dated November 21, 1995, and has updated it as needed or required in order to comply with federal regulations; and		
WHEREAS,	in keeping with this obligation and as a recipient of federal and state funds under the Federal Transit Act, a amended, the County of Buncombe must adopt a drug and alcohol testing policy that complies with all applicable federal regulations governing and requiring anti-drug and alcohol misuse programs in the workplace, including 49 CFR Parts 40 and 655, as amended, as well as 49 CFR Part 29 relating to the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988; and		
WHEREAS,	the County of Buncombe is entrusted with the health and safety of its citizens and is dedicated to providing safe, effective, transportation services for citizens through Mountain Mobility, Buncombe County's Community Transportation System; and
