## **Less Plastic Buncombe Month**

**WHEREAS,** Earth Day is April 22 and this year's global theme is Planet vs. Plastics, which calls for widespread awareness of the health risks of plastics and a rapid phaseout of all single-use plastics; and

WHEREAS, single-use plastic products including expanded polystyrene (Styrofoam<sup>™</sup>) are disposable and not designed for repeated use and are typically produced from petrochemicals; and

**WHEREAS,** a significant volume of single-use plastic is discarded and becomes litter found in rivers, roadways, and other public and private areas throughout Buncombe County and its environs; and

**WHEREAS,** a 2022 waste characterization study indicated that over 14.3% of Buncombe's landfilled residential waste is non-recyclable plastic; and

**WHEREAS,** single-use plastic bag litter blocks storm drains, becomes entangled in treetops, and fouls public areas; and

**WHEREAS,** single-use plastic litter can degrade into microplastics that threaten the environment and public health and have been detected in the French Broad River; and

**WHEREAS,** reducing the use of single-use plastics in our community will bolster the County's solid waste operations and extend the lifespan of our local landfill; and

WHEREAS, single-use plastic reduction will safeguard community health and wellbeing; and

**WHEREAS,** Buncombe County is dedicated to reducing its carbon footprint, improving the quality of its French Broad waters and maintaining a clean and healthy environment; and

**WHEREAS,** Buncombe County is dedicated to developing equitable sustainable procurement processes; and

**WHEREAS,** Buncombe County is dedicated to reducing single-use plastic consumption by replacing such products with alternatives where feasible and beneficial; and

**WHEREAS,** Buncombe County is dedicated to encouraging its employees to use reusable products and practices as part of a broader strategy to reduce plastic waste and protect the environment; and

**WHEREAS,** Buncombe County is currently providing information and resources through the Less Plastic Buncombe campaign to encourage residents to reduce their single-use plastic consumption;

**NOW THEREFORE,** the Buncombe County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim April 2024 as **Less Plastic Buncombe Month** in Buncombe County, NC and urge all government entities, private businesses, and residents to forgo or limit their use of plastic bags, other single-use plastics, and expanded polystyrene (Styrofoam<sup>TM</sup>) wherever and whenever possible.
