#### Opioid Settlement Overview



Summer, 2021

"These companies made billions of dollars while millions of Americans got hooked on opioids. In North Carolina, we've already lost at least 20,000 people to this crisis, and countless families more have been devastated by loss and addiction. That's why I led a bi-partisan coalition of attorneys general from across the country to hold them accountable. We achieved the second largest state attorney general settlement in history – \$26 billion."

- Buncombe County is scheduled to receive \$29,249,904 between 2022-2038
  - Roughly \$2 million per year till 2027
- Purpose: to support programs or services that serve persons with Opioid Use
   Disorder or any co-occurring Substance Use Disorder or mental health conditions

### **Key Findings**

#### **Strengths**

- Community Paramedic PORT Team
- Jail MAT Program
- High number of treatment providers
- County diversion and community re-entry programs
- Syringe Service Program supporting
  - Harm reduction
  - MOUD access
  - Naloxone distribution

#### **Opportunities for Change**

- Public engagement and education
- Support young people: Prevention education;
   Mental health and substance use treatment;
   Prosocial connection
- Increase shelter and housing access
- Increase inpatient treatment and MOUD access
- Expand education & career development programs
- Promote community and connection

#### Gaps

- Affordable housing
- Mental health care
- Limited public transportation
- Lack of cultural diversity among providers
- Exclusions for care: Sobriety requirements;
   Criminal history; MOUD Utilization
- Inefficient coordination across systems

#### **Challenges**

- COVID-19: Increase in social isolation and mental health stressors
- Service provider burnout, turnover, staffing challenges
- High cost of living and growing unhoused population
- Rural locality, geographically isolated communities
- Stigma and marginalization of people who use substances

#### FY 2024 Impact: Collaborative Strategic Planning

- Fatal Overdose Emergency Response
  - Enhanced data analysis & interpretation to inform decision-making
  - Strategic planning to reduce barriers to accessing treatment
  - Identifying gaps and strategies to connect people to care
- Centering equity and addressing rising overdose rates in historically marginalized communities
  - Inclusive Connection & Healing Coordinator position in the Office of Equity & Human Rights
  - Language and cultural visibility centered in public messaging & outreach events
  - Collaboration with trusted community partners to build programs in historically marginalized communities
- Enhancing connections to care
  - Collaboration with sheriff's office, community paramedics and mental health professionals responding to substance use/ behavioral health-related incidents in the community


- Video advertising:

- Audio advertising to targeted demographics:

- Events:
  - Let's Talk Opioids with Dr. Shukla Facebook live reaching 2,200+ in English and 150+ in Spanish
  - Opioids in the Black Community event: 100+ attendees
  - Upcoming partnership and community trainings at GrindFest three-day festival





#### FY 2024 Impact: Recovery Support Services

- Community Paramedics have increased capacity to respond to overdoses and conduct outreach.
  - Paramedics at the detention center providing information, resources, and to offer medications for opioid use disorder if needed.




#### <u>Community Re-entry Services</u> = 225 individuals served FY24 Q1-Q3

- Social & community context



### FY 2024 Impact: Naloxone Distribution

- Increase in Naloxone distribution allowing further community saturation and distribution to community partners involved in this work, with a focus on BIPOC community partners.
- Increase in trainings and outreach efforts on overdose awareness,
   Naloxone use and Harm Reduction.



### **Strategic Priorities**

- Emphasis on collaboration and communication between County Programs to promote sustainability of programming
  - Substance Use Response Group: launching July 2024
    - Coordinated budget planning & evaluation
    - Enhanced data collection and analysis
    - Collaborative strategy identification and program development
- Maintain focus on life-saving efforts for those most at risk today
  - Expanding telehealth MOUD access for uninsured community paramedic PORT participants
  - Emphasis on equity and culturally competent treatment options
