PREPAREDNESS ONGOING

- EOP Completed: 06/24/24
- COOP Finalized: 09/23/24
- Initial Response: 9/25/24 Partial EOC Opened
- Buncombe County Board of Commissioners declared a Local State of Emergency
 @3pm on 9/25/24
- State of Emergency Declared by NC: 9/25/24

BUNCOMBE COUNTY

• Evacuee Shelter Opened: 9/25/24

IMMEDIATE RESPONSE DAYS

RECOVERY WEEKS-MONTHS LONG-TERM RECOVERY MONTHS-YEARS

- Predecessor Rain Event: 9/26/24
- Evacuation Orders Issued to Residents: 9/26/24
- Community Shelters Opened: 9/27/24
- Presidential Disaster Declaration: 9/29/24
- Water Distribution Sites Began Operation: 9/30/24

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC)

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EOC Objectives

- Ensure the safety of responders and the community for the duration of the incident.
- Provide for the immediate & ongoing basic and hygienic needs for affected communities.
- Keep the **public and key stakeholders informed** on the status of the recovery efforts.
- Develop immediate-term and long-term
 Recovery Plan.

COMBE COUNTY

- Monitor **debris management** operations and improve access into affected areas.
- Provide **support and coordination** to county departments, local municipalities, and partner agencies to strengthen joint efforts and ensure a unified response for community recovery.

INITIAL RESPONSE

• Emergency/Rescue Efforts

- 5,500 calls received to 911 by 9/28
- 18 USAR & swift water teams supporting operations

Communications

- Widespread & enduring Internet and cellular outages
- Online geotagging damage reporting tool launched 10/5

Infrastructure

- 1,989 landslides identified
- Roadway damage; Interstates I-40 & I-26 closed
- More than 350 bridges damaged or destroyed
- Widespread water outages and water infrastructure disruption

• Electricity

- Nearly 100,000 households without power (10/2)
- Sheltering
 - 585 people sheltered (peaked on 10/8)
- Donations and Volunteer Management
 - 840 volunteers deployed to Family Assistance Center (10/3)

CURRENT RESPONSE & RECOVERY PRIORITIES

POINTS OF DISTRIBUTION & COMMUNITY CARE STATIONS

- 8 locations currently open (County-specific sites)
- Nearly 100,000 cases + 200,000+ gallons of potable water & 84,000 gallons non-potable water distributed as of 11/18
- 29,177+ showers and 25,850+ loads of laundry as of 11/18

FOOD ASSISTANCE

 16,950 households approved for DSNAP for \$10+ million in benefits

• PUBLIC HEALTH

- Monitoring and awareness of outbreaks & health risks
- 1,700+ vaccines administered by 11/7

DEBRIS REMOVAL

BUNCOMBE COUNTY

 10M+ cubic yards of debris estimated; 174K collected as of 11/18





CURRENT RESPONSE & RECOVERY PRIORITIES

TEMPORARY HOUSING SOLUTIONS (FEMA)

- 1,664 households checked into transitional sheltering assistance as of 11/13
- 149 households approved for direct housing assistance.
- 4 direct housing unit placed on private sites

• DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS (COMMUNITY & PUBLIC)

- 214 linear miles of floodplain impact; \$1.2+ in agriculture crop loss
- 1,150 initial damage assessments completed (out of 2,092; approx. 54%). These include damage points within the City of Asheville

RESTABLISHING COUNTY SERVICES

• Successful 2024 election effort

NCOMBE COUNTY

 Public-facing services and facilities opening, such as permits office, health clinic, some parks/libraries & more reopening

RESOURCES LEVERAGED

• SUPPORT FROM MULTIPLE STATES

- Mutual aid from 38 States
- 16 state and federal rescue teams joined local teams

STATE MOBILIZAITON

 North Carolina Emergency Management with support from other state offices

FEDERAL MOBILIZATION

BUNCOMBE COUNTY

- Up to 400 National Guard personnel mobilized; Demobilization 11/19
- Up to 300 active military personnel
- Hundreds of FEMA staff in Buncombe County and many other federal agencies on the ground locally


COMMUNITY RELIEF PROGRAMS

FEMA Individual and Household Assistance

- 52,129+ households approved as of 11/18
- \$16+M approved for home repairs and rental assistance (2,850 households) as of 11/18
- Application deadline extended to 1/7/25
- Community Navigation available at various locations and mobile throughout county
- County Small Business Grants & Individual Assistance launching soon

\$78 million in FEMA assistance has been provided to survivors as of 11/15

EMERGING ISSUES

• PRIVATE PROPERTY DEBRIS REMOVAL (PPDR)

• Multi-channel application (in person, mobile, etc.) launching week of 11/18

DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS & FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT

• Costing damage to public facilities and properties, issuing emergency permits, conducting substantial damage assessments

DISASTER GRANT FUNDING

- FEMA Public Assistance for county, municipalities, fire districts, schools, nonprofits
- LONG TERM RECOVERY GROUP
 - Nonprofit/Community-driven collaboration launching week of 11/18
- DEMOBILIZATION OF EMERGENCY FUNCTIONS
 - Emergency Support resources and functions demobilizing as feasible
- ACTIVATION OF RECOVERY SUPPORT FUNCTIONS
 - Task forces assessing needs & establishing 30/60/90 day goals

RECOVERY SUPPORT FUNCTIONS

- TRANSITION FROM EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO RECOVERY SUPPORT
 - Establishing 7 Recovery Support Functions
