Air quality fees are determined by the Asheville-Buncombe Air Quality (AB Air Quality) Board per the Interlocal Agreement between Buncombe County and the City of Asheville. These fees including definitions and additional details not listed above are included in Chapter 17. 0203 of the Agency's regulations, which can be found under 'regulations and forms' on the website at www.abcairquality.org. With the exception of the annual Title V tonnage fee which is determined each year by the Board as part of the budget process and the annual Consumer Price Index annual increase for Title V facilities, all other fees are adopted into the AB Air Quality Code through the Agency's rule making process which includes public notice and comment procedures. Chapter 1 of the AB Air Quality Code includes the Interlocal Agreement, the authority under which the program is administered.
