PROCLAMATION

• Minority Enterprise Development Week

Commissioner Bailey read the proclamation and moved for its approval. Commissioner Peterson seconded the motion and it passed 3-0. Commissioner Bailey presented this proclamation to Hope Husky, Chair of the Minority Enterprise Development and Sharon Oendine.

Ms. Husky said that this was the 27th year of MED week and awarding of the outstanding minority business owners for the region.

PUBLIC HEARING

• Proposed Use of FY 2012 Rural Operation Assistance Program Funds

Denise Braine, County Planner, said this was the annual request for rural operation transportation funds. She introduced Hope Bleeker the Regional Transportation Planner with Land of Sky Regional Council who took over the administration of Mountain Mobility. Ms. Bleeker reviewed the proposed uses of the transportation funds that were included in the grant proposal and outlined in the attachments to the minutes. She said that current services will be maintained but no additional services will be added. She encouraged anyone that wanted to make comments on the grant to fill out a form that she supplied.

The Vice Chairman opened the public hearing 4:46 p.m.

Don Yelton requested that the County implement an annual report on the miles and cost per passenger for the Mountain Mobility system. Denise Braine said that this information could be found on the county website.

Jerry Rice asked why the system wasn't evaluated before it went to a private company. He said his concern was that there should be more jobs for the disabled and a review of the effectiveness of the system.

The Chairman closed the hearing at 4:51 p.m.

Commissioner Peterson moved to adopt the resolution as presented. Commissioner Bailey seconded the motion and it passed 3-0.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

Wanda Greene, County Manager, said that the County was in the process of condemning the CTS property and removal of the buildings. In addition, the owners are being asked to keep the property cleaned up. She said that EPA and the citizens committee are aware of these actions.

NEW BUSINESS

• Buncombe Green Update

Jon Creighton, Assistant County Manager/Planning Director, presented the power point that is attached to the minutes reviewing the landfill gas to energy project and solid waste projects that are reducing the carbon footprint. He reviewed the bioreactor and the generators that will provide electricity for 1,100 homes in the area.

He said that Buncombe is the only county in the state that has a weekly household hazardous waste collection day. Since 2004 the County had removed and recycled 450 old mobile homes. The new courts building will be LEED certified building with over 100,000 square feet of space.

Greg Isreal, General Services Director, gave the Carbon Footprint and Energy Use report for 2010 which is attached to the minutes of this meeting. He said that the County's 2010 energy costs were more than \$1.6 million for 2010 and if no energy efficiency measures had been implemented, the 2010 costs would have been more than \$2.4 million

He reviewed the energy reinvestment fund for future projects to reduce the carbon footprint and reduce energy costs and increase energy efficiency.

Commissioner Peterson recommended that everyone visit buncombecounty.org/green to see everything the County is doing.

Commissioner Peterson moved to appoint **Keith Webb** to the **Parks Greenways and Recreation Advisory Board.** The motion passed 3-0.

Discussion was held regarding a possible economic development incentive for a new company considering location to the County. The company would bring 200 jobs with an \$80 million investment paying an average wage of \$50,000. No action was taken.

Commissioner Bailey moved to return to open session. Commissioner Peterson seconded and the motion passed 3-0.

Commissioner Bailey moved to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Peterson seconded and the motion assed 3-0.
