



Families who include children from different biological fathers





In Fact.....

- Children residing in households with adults unrelated to them (primarily an adult male) had <u>six to eight times</u> the risk of dying of maltreatment than children in households with two biological parents
- Children residing with step parents and those living with other, related adults who are not a biologic parent (e.g. grandparents, aunts, uncles) were also at increased of maltreatment death


It should be noted that: Risk is not elevated for children living with a single parent, as long as no other adults live in the home



- Prevention Social Worker, School Social Worker and Nurse model – in five schools
- Collaboration with CCWNC to ensure alignment between prevention and CC4C programming
- Contract with Mission Children's Center for a pediatric, forensic Nurse
- Evidence Based/Informed Practices and Programming:
 - Triple P
 - Play and Learn Groups
 - Nurse Family Partnership
 - Nurturing Parenting
 - Circle of Parents Men's Group

Prevention/Intervention

 Embedded in vulnerable communities – beginning in Pisgah View Apartment Community

 Two Prevention Social Workers - Vulnerability assessments on all children under six who are reported, then follow up case management
