The Chairman called the meeting to order with the following members present:

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

INVOCATION

The Chairman gave the invocation.

The Chairman reminded the Board that in accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. He asked if any Board member had any known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matter coming before the Board. None were stated.

PUBLIC COMMENT

The Chairman reviewed the rules for public comment:

- The time limit for any comment to the Board is three minutes.
- If your time expires then you may leave any questions along with your name, address and phone number with the County Manager.
- Board members are not expected to comment on matters during public comment.
- Comments should be limited to subjects that are within the jurisdiction of this Commission or pertain to matters upon which it may act.
- Any individual speaking during public comment shall address the entire Board. Any polling of Board members is inappropriate.
- Persons addressing the Board are expected to observe the decorum of the Chamber, and to be respectful of everyone in the room.
- Any person who willfully interrupts, disturbs, or disrupts the session will be asked to leave the meeting.
- The Board reserves the right to deny public addresses on a subject previously presented to the Board.

Larry Smith talked about the politics in the county, his public information requests and taxes.

Jerry Rice was concerned about the tax rate stating that it was the Commissioners responsibility to set the tax rate. He felt the proposed tax rate increase was coming from the Commissioners and not the staff or the legislators. He requested that the County tax rate be lowered.

Christina Merrill addressed the potential tax increase stating that many people feel they should have gotten a tax break and are not going to be able to pay their taxes under the proposed increase.

GOOD NEWS

• 4-H Robotics Program

John Schantz, a Cooperative Extension volunteer who began a robotics program for youth in the 4-H clubs, said that the program trains 10 to 14 year olds in Buncombe County on how to build and design robots for specific tasks. The program was for home schooled and traditionally schooled kids and was free.

Holly Jordan, Cooperative Extension Agent and coordinator of the 4-H program in Buncombe County for ages 5-18, said that they did a variety of programs including the robotics for approximately 2,300 kids every year. These programs were run by volunteers in the community.

PROCLAMATIONS

Autism Awareness Month

Vice Chair Jones read the proclamation and moved for its approval. Commissioner King seconded and the motion passed 7-0. Vice Chair Jones presented the proclamation to Mr. Joe Yurchak with the WNC Autism Society who thanked the Board for the proclamation.

Foster Care Appreciation Month

Commissioner King read the proclamation and moved for its approval. Commissioner Fryar seconded and the motion passed 7-0. Commissioner King presented the proclamation to Tara Foster with Buncombe County Health and Human Services who spoke briefly about the foster care program. Commissioner Belcher said that his daughter and son-in-law were foster parents and it had been a rewarding experience.

Motorcycle Awareness Month

Commissioner Belcher said that a member of his church who was a motorcycle rider had recently been killed and he dedicated the proclamation to that family. He read the proclamation and moved for its approval. Commissioner Newman seconded and the motion passed 7-0. Roger Coleman and another member of the motorcycle awareness program thanked the Board for their endorsement and for helping making drivers motorcycle aware.

She said that the County ranked in the top 20 healthiest counties in North Carolina but North Carolina ranked 33 out of the 50 states. needs of the community, including a farmers market at 40 Coxe Avenue providing food from the Pisgah View garden.
