Amount	There are no restrictions on the amount of funding requested or granted
Length	1 year
Restrictions	Programs must serve Buncombe County youth, with priority for youth currently involved with the juvenile justice system. Funding must be used to meet the needs of youth involved in the juvenile justice system first; if there are additional funds they may be used to address prevention needs. The use of these funds in Buncombe County require a 30% local match.

Organizations	Only local public agencies, 501c3 non-profits and local housing authorities will be considered for funding. New applicants are required to have an orientation

Projects	Funding priorities are based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the services. The following program types will be considered for funding: Priority 1: Restitution/Community Service; Priority 2: Comprehensive Clinical Assessments/Individual or Group Counseling; Priority 3: Teen Court/Restorative Services; Priority 4: Runaway/ Temporary Shelter; Priority 5: Interpersonal or Experiential Skills; Priority 6: Vocational Skills; Priority 7: Substance Use Services; Priority 8: Parent/Family Skill Building; Priority 9: Structured Day/Tutoring/Academic Enhancement/ Mentoring

	component.; Awareness of and sensitivity to Racial Ethnic Disparity that exists in the County; Programs are encouraged to provide effective programming that includes restorative justice practices.

	Applicants are encouraged to request \$80,000 or less
Length	1-year grant. No more than 3 years per project
Restrictions	Organizations must operate in Buncombe County with service to Buncombe County.
	Projects that more closely align with other Buncombe County grant programs will be referred to those processes. Projects will not be considered for funding by more than one County grant program.
