## How the Funds Were Used

Babies Need Bottoms provided economic support to the community through the Diaper Assistance to Early Childcare Education Centers Program. By partnering with local Early Childhood Education Centers, Babies Need Bottoms was able to provide diapers, wipes, and other essential items to enrolled lowincome families that could be utilized outside of the childcare centers normal operating hours - during nights, weekends, and school breaks and holidays. A total of 110,550 essential items were distributed through eight partner agencies to serve 3,444 children since the start of the grant period. This includes 106,536 diapers and 3,230 packs of wipes. This project ensured more children in our community are having basic needs met while caregivers received material support to help stretch their household budgets further.

## Results

- 3,444 children served
- 106,536 diapers distributed
- 3,230 packs of baby wipes distributed
"As our community and organization moved from a period of emergency response during the pandemic, to a post-pandemic recovery, this funding helped bridge the gap to meet basic needs at a time when families faced extraordinary challenges compounded by decreased pandemic-related assistance, a nationwide formula shortage, inflation and increased cost of goods."
