How the Funds Were Used

The Center for Agricultural and Food Entrepreneurship (CAFE) utilized grant funds to support small businesses in Buncombe County including food manufacturers, caterers, food truck operators and farmers seeking to add value to their agricultural production. Project activities that supported CAFE clients included providing technical services at no cost to assess needs, arranging free training, coordinating production time and commissary access in FDA-inspected kitchens, equipping commercial kitchens with needed equipment, providing multi-lingual access to services, and operating Blue Ridge Food Ventures with a focus on growth sustainability for creating jobs and income. CAFE exceeded performance expectations by servicing 76 local businesses and helping to create 54 full-time and 122 part-time jobs in the community. The project also supported clients in retaining 115 full-time and 165 part-time jobs.

Because of this funding support, our facility was able to purchase and install equipment critical to client operations, allowing them to increase production volume while lowering their overhead, resulting in increased income and viability for their businesses.
