We work directly with families experiencing houselessness, children in foster care, and job seeking single parent households. All participants are offered case management services as well as childcare. This past quarter, the Director of the Empowerment Childcare completed case management with 90% of participants that use the Empowerment Childcare by helping them set up short and or long term goals. The demographics include the following: 52 white, 20 Black, 2 hispanic, and 0 mixed/other. The Empowerment Childcare is the first YWCA program to integrate onto a new Apricot database at the YWCA. This database will add ability to track client services, impact, and the needs of our community.

#### Quarter 2

The Empowerment Childcare provided over 3,680 hours of children to over 66 families. During this time families seek services such as employment, educational needs and meeting day treatment requirements.
