KAA is a Christian sports camp for urban youth and their mentors, empowering them to become leaders who revolutionize the inner city. Will have two Impact retreats at the Blue Ridge YMCA in the fall. Plan to start a pilot-Character program in 2 City schools and 2 County Schools in the fall. Asheville Middle School & Erwin Middle School will use the Program (HABITUDES) and at Hall Fletcher & Johnston will use (Character Counts). Will work with both school systems and 40+ volunteers to create a way to offer mentoring and support to the kids that need it the most. Plans are to do another December community event that will honor those kids and their achievements for the year.

Quality Education

Organization Description*

Tell us about your organization. What is your mission? Highlight two or three key facts and accomplishments that best define your organization.

In 2018 a group of concerned citizens decided to take on the responsibility of impacting 101 of the most at risk kids in the county. We partnered with several youth organization and the Housing Authority, City and Buncombe County schools, Helpmate and the others that provide services to this youth group. We have 40 men and women who volunteer time to impact the youth. The impact that we as a community can have on each one of these kids by showing them that they matter, have value and that we care will have long term rewards in society. We started with a trip to KAA camp in Missouri with 98 adults and kids. Each Monday 8-12 men & women would visit a school to greet kids and support staff. So far 10 schools were impacted. Some of the men became mentors at the schools and we even had lunch with some classrooms. We had our Impact retreat in Oct with 96 kids and 34 adults volunteers at the YMCA Blue Ridge Assembly. In Dec we had a celebration for the kids at our Giving Junction.

Project Description

What do you propose to do? What is your plan? What are your goals?

We propose to take 101 kids from Buncombe County to Kids Across America Camp in July. We will have two Impact retreats at the Blue Ridge YMCA in the fall. We plan to start a pilot-Character program in 2 City schools and 2 County Schools in the fall. Asheville Middle School & Erwin Middle School we will use the Program (HABITUDES) and at Hall Fletcher & Johnston we will use (Character Counts). We will work with both school systems and our 40 + volunteers to create a way to offer mentoring and support to the kids that need it the most. Our plans are to do another December community event that will honor those kids and their achievements for the year.

Key Steps*

How will the project work? What are specific activities and milestones that your project entails?

Each week a group of Chosen members will be assigned to a city or county school. This group will coordinate with the administrators about the activities that they would like the group to be involve in. School greetings, after school tutoring, public speaking, encouragement, reading aloud, etc.. We will select a group of kids to attend KAA in the summer working with SRO's and youth organizations to identify the kids that are most at risk. We will partner with the Sheriffs dept. "On Track" program to create more opportunities for those kids in their program. We will have Character Days that we will check on the progress of each child and encourage them to be people of high character. We will use a reward system to celebrate High character moments.

Last year we had kids represented from almost every district. This year we plan to reach even more kids across the county by working with the resource officers from every school. We also know that by working with established youth mentoring programs we will have the opportunity to reach even more kids. Our goal is to recruit more community members that we will be able to have teams that partner with the schools and

work along side of the administrators and with the SRO's. Last year we served kids from Asheville High, Asheville middle, Montford NorthStar, AC Reynolds, Irb Jones, Claxton, Erwin High, Erwin Middle, TC Robertson, Eblen, SILSA, Dickson, Valley Springs Middle, Hall Fletcher, Jones Elem.

101 kids between the ages of 9-18 in Buncombe County. Our goal is to target kids that are considered at risk. Many of our kids live in subsidies housing, homeless shelters or foster care. We work with multiple youth organizations to help us identify kids that would most benefit from our activities.

These are the organizations that we work with to reach the kids in 2018, Asheville City Schools, Buncombe County Schools, Asheville Housing Authority, YTL, MDTMT, Gladiator Sports, Helpmate, Buncombe County SRO's. We partner with the schools system to provide mentoring and encouragement to certain students. The housing authority has promoted this to the residents and we help with back to school events. The Homeless Social Workers in the schools refer children for the program. We have kids that are members of YTL, MDTMT, MSTMT & Gladiator Sports so we refer families looking for weekly programs for their youth to these programs. Helpmate refers children that have been in DV situations and working with the SRO's has been one of the biggest source of referrals.

We now have over 60 members made up of every race in Buncombe County so we believe the more people we can get to the table the larger the impact we can have on our kids.
