Organization*

The mission of Montford Park Players' (MPP) is to serve as North Carolina's longest running Shakespeare theatre company, primarily dedicated to performing the works of Shakespeare, and dedicated to providing exceptional dramatic entertainment for the enrichment, education, and enjoyment of our audiences.

MMP was established as a 501 © 3 organization in 1973 and performs in the Hazel Robinson Amphitheatre nestled in the historic Montford neighborhood of Asheville from May to October at no charge. We operate on funds from individual contributions, audience contributions, sponsors, grants, and concessions. Recognized as North Carolina's longest performing Shakespeare Festival, we are a member of Southeastern Conference (SETC), the Shakespeare Theatre Association, and the Institute of Outdoor Theatre. We are the recipient of support from the North Carolina Arts Council, a division of the Dept. of Cultural

Resources, with funding from the National Endowment for the Arts with funding through the Asheville Area Arts Council.

For more than 47 years Montford Park Players has provided citizens with the opportunity to actively engage in our community, whether as volunteer actor or stagehand working behind the scenes to produce entertaining and enriching theatre in a wonderful outdoor venue at no cost to anyone. Executive Director since 2006, John Russell was awarded the Mark R. Sumner Award in 2018 by the Outdoor Theatre Council, The Sumner Award recognizes significant contributions by an individual to a specific drama, or to the outdoor drama movement, including but not limited to playwriting, directing, acting, design, theater architecture, patronage, scholarship, musical composition, technology and innovation, producing and administration. He was appointed to the Board of North Carolina Arts Council in July 2017 by Governor Roy Cooper. He currently serves on the North Carolina Governor's School Foundation Board and the Asheville Area Arts Council Advisory Board.

Need for the Project*

What is the main issue this project is established to address? What data or qualitative factors/stories are available to show that need?

Montford Park Players' stage is nestled at the bottom of a naturally steep landscape. Pathways of deep mulch lead to grass terraced seating areas. An even steeper, well-worn, and frequently patched roadway is the only point of egress for actors, staff, and those with mobility issues who want to attend or participate in performances. We want to make our productions accessible to all regardless of their physical abilities. Many of our loyal patrons find it difficult to navigate the primitive mulch paths that lead to terraced seating carved into a hillside by SeaBees in 1983, prior to existing ADA laws and a consciousness that values making public spaces accessible to those with mobility challenges.

The Parking Lot Project would establish six (6) paved handicapped parking spaces, two of which would be van accessible, repave an existing roadway leading to the small parking lot located behind the stage house, and modify the existing grass and mulch pathway from the parking area to our newly created accessible brick terraced seating area designated for people with mobility issues and their caregivers and/or family.

Project*

The goal of the project is to make theatre accessible to all. The Board of Directors publicly launched a campaign in October 2019 to generate support in response to a one-for-one \$25,000 Challenge grant from an anonymous donor. We hope to secure funding to break ground and complete the project before the 2021 Season Opening Show in May of 2021. The result of the project will create access to free, outdoor theatre currently inaccessible to caregivers, family members and people living with mobility issues so that they can experience classical Shakespeare theatre in an intimate setting that promotes inclusion and a sense of community and well being.

How many people will be served by this project? Describe the people served, including demographics such as geography, income, race & ethnicity, age, etc.

The number of potential visitors living with mobility issues including paralysis, stroke, spinal cord injury, Multiple Sclerosis, and ALS that could be served by the Montford Park Players' accessible parking project is difficult to determine, however there are several data points to consider. Most of our audience is made up of residents of North Carolina.

The greatest contributors to limited mobility and paralysis include stroke, spinal cord injury, Multiple sclerosis, and ALS. Research conducted by the Christopher & Dana Reeve Foundation in 2013 (https://www.christopherreeve.org/living-with-paralysis/stats-about-paralysis), indicates the number of North Carolinians living with stroke (33.7 percent), spinal cord injury (27.3 percent) and multiple sclerosis (18.6 percent) are listed below:

Utilizing a one half of one percent calculation of the figures for stroke, spinal cord injury, Muscular Sclerosis, and ALS for the number of people in North Carolina living with paralysis or limited mobility would result in the potential of 15,254 people in North Carolina benefiting from the Montford Park Player's proposed accessibility modification.

Results*

What results do you hope to achieve with this project? Be specific about how much impact the project will have in line with Commissioner focus areas.

One of the unique benefits of experiencing theatre in an intimate, outdoor venue like ours is the sense of community it creates among the audience. Shakespeare's plays are recognized for their universal appeal to a wide range of audiences. The shared experience of humor, tragedy, hope and despair connects the audience to the actors and to fellow audience members. That shared experience creates a rich sense of inclusion and community among audience members. Making this accessible for those living with limited mobility (and their caregivers), adds opportunities for social, creative, and intellectual stimulation that are known to contribute to a greater sense of well-being. Based on a one-to-one ratio, the potential number of caregivers and family members attending Montford Park Players' theatre productions would be 39,508 (15,254 X 2).

Evaluation*

How will you know you have succeeded? Explain the project evaluation process, including specific measures that will be tracked.

Success will be measured by completing the project in time for the opening night of the 2021 season, May 1, 2021 thereby, creating opportunities for people living with mobility issues to attend performances that were not previously accessible. Further evaluation will be measured by the utilization of the dedicated parking and seating areas.

The Montford Park Players project not only increases independent living for people with mobility issues, but also their family and caregivers. Everyone would benefit. The project promotes inclusion and supports the integration into the physical and cultural community of those with mobility issues by making it possible to access designated parking and seating areas currently inaccessible.

The Montford Park Players has leased the property from the City of Asheville's Department of Parks and Recreation since 1983 on a dollar-a-year basis. We partnered with a local Eagle Scout and community volunteers to establish the brick terrace that will be dedicated to those with mobility issues. A local business provided the bricks and sand used at a highly reduced rate. Additionally, individuals and businesses purchased bricks as part of the projects.

Our audience totaled 13,600 people last year. Twenty nine (29) percent of our audience came from outside western North Carolina. Utilizing the formula used by the Buncombe County Tourism Development Authority, last year's visitors (3,819) to Montford Park Players' performances translated to \$1,230,018 in economic impact to the Asheville/Buncombe County area.

The Accessible Parking and Seating Project requires the services of MPP's Executive Director John Russell and Director of Donor Relations, Beth Coakley; Todd Henson, owner and General Contractor with GCA Contracting, and Michael Goforth, President of High Country Engineering and Civil Engineer, and three Construction Helpers with GCA Contracting. The Executive Director will coordinate the construction improvement activity with Mr. Henson and his construction helpers. Russell will oversee Mr. Goforth's role as project and permitting liaison with the Asheville Department of Parks and Recreation.

Ms. Coakley will provide fundraising, marketing, and communications expertise for the project. Todd Henson will implement and manage all aspects of construction improvements of the project including repaving the access road, parking spots, and pathways from the parking area to the bricked terrace.
