Funding for one-time costs (such as equipment, training, materials or staffing) to help get a project on greater footing

Project: Adolescent Support

- Connect minority-identifying clients with minorityidentifying therapists
- Establish therapy groups for teens and/or their parents
- Provide sessions on issues related to bullying, discrimination, social isolation & more
- Goal to serve 60 youth & their families

Project:

Independent Living Skills

- Support people with Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Expand independent living skills program with onsite laundry (washer/dryer)
- Provide instruction in clothing care and maintenance to participants in the Friends Group

Project: Youth Engagement & Crime Prevention

- Operate Big Ivy Community Center in Bardnardsville
- Increase partnership with Buncombe County Sheriff's Office
- Install safety & security equipment
- Upgrade picnic shelter area
- Host Youth Night community events

Project: Reaching Adults With Disabilities

- Provide physical fitness programming such as yoga, Pilates, dance, and chair fitness through live, virtual instruction and on demand videos to athletes with intellectual and mobility disabilities
- Partner with Irene Wortham Center to build a multisensory library of resources & activities





Bountiful Cities

Project: Asheville Buncombe Food Policy Council

- Identify low-wealth neighborhoods with existing outdoor food pantries and/or community gardens that are interested in expanding to a community refrigerator, root cellar, or other cold-storage infrastructure
- Work with identified neighborhood residents to plan and install the equipment and sustain their project





Bountiful Cities

Project: Southside Community Grocery Project

- Purchase healthy goods from local farmers and food producers with an emphasis on BIPOC farmers
- Create additional pantry space in the Southside neighborhood for the distribution of dry goods and shelfstable products
- Distribute goods for free to neighborhood residents



Bounty & Soul

Project: Building Trust, Affinity & Engagement

- Create a website for community engagement
- Build an education platform that will make health and wellness classes, recipes, and cooking tutorials more equitably accessible to participants
- Connect community members through the new platform

- Distribute for Head Start families for the purpose of continued learning over the summer months that classes are not in session

- Recruit adults of color to be trained as paid literacy tutors
- Enroll students in grades 1-5 for tutoring, and match tutors to provide 45-minute free literacy lesson twice weekly for at least one school year







Agency: Mount Zion Community Development

Project: Grandparents are Truly Essential

- Engage grandparents (biological & non-biological) in Project NAF (Nurturing Asheville Area Families)... a program that provides support to pregnant and postpartum Africa American women and their children
- Host virtual education sessions using a research-based home visiting curriculum









PivotPoint WNC

Project: High Quality Facilitator Training

- Enroll facilitators in training/skill development courses including Motivational Interviewing & Clinical First Responder
- Equip facilitators for therapeutic adventure work such as day program, family intensive & experiential outpatient

Literacy Where We Live

- Engage youth in the Burton Street Community in repairing and building little free community libraries and organizing a literacy-driven community event
- Distribute culturally responsive books & reading kits
- Center youth voices from in creating positive literacy experiences for young readers

Take Me to the River

- Partner with area afterschool programs to incorporate environmental education into their curricula & activities
- Conduct educational activities with students in afterschool programs





Agency: Shiloh Community Association

Project: Urban Ecology at the Garden

 Partner with an ecologist to teach workshops at the Shiloh Community Garden to educate people on the importance of urban ecology

 Conduct free educational outreach with emphasis on black and brown youths who often do not have access to such opportunities



Agency: Sunrise Community for Recovery & Wellness

Project: Cultivating Connection

- Connect people who are living in vulnerable conditions to resources that build resilience, improve health, remove barriers & reduce isolation
- Purchase and distribute items such as hygiene supplies, bus tickets & phones/phone cards and assist with necessary documents such as IDs & birth certificates







Agency: Swannanoa Community Council

Project: Fox Creek Environmental Restoration

- Undertake an environmental restoration and community education project on the Fox Creek site, a 2.35-acre parcel of land in the Grovemont neighborhood
- Engage volunteers in work to preserve and enhance wetlands, water quality, and botanical wildlife
- Conduct community education regarding invasive species removal, bird survey training and restoration





Agency: Warrior Canine Connection

Project: Connecting Veterans

- Connect veterans through the healing power of dogs
- Utilize a Mission Based Trauma Recovery model to help recovering Warriors reconnect with life, their families, their communities, and each other
- Provide Trauma Recovery programing at Charles George
