**Narrative summary of grant related activities**

Although LEAF Global Arts has served only 25% of the students with the Tipping Point grant funds, the survey outcomes are strong. We expected to have an increase in number of opportunities for field trips over the winter and spring, especially in serving Out-of-School-Time partners during teacher work days and holidays January - June. Youth engaged with professionally-trained and highly-experienced Resident Teaching Artists in visual arts with Kelsey Moseley (Flying Paper project) and Edwin Salas (Paper Puppet Folklore project), movement with Irvegg Romero-Gallegos (breakdancing) and Molly Graves (theater), and music with Adama Dembele (Africa drumming) and Irvegg Romero-Gallegos (Latin drumming). One challenge we have had is lack of transportation staff to bring students to LEAF Global. One community partner expressed that they have had trouble finding CDL drivers with flexible schedules who are willing to help transport youth during Teacher Work Days and holiday day camps.
