June 2, 2020

**Opening**

The scheduled meeting of the Buncombe County Board of Elections was called to order at 5:01PM June 2, 2020 at 77 McDowell Street, Asheville, NC 28801.

In response to the COVID-19 threat and NC Stay at Home Order, the board meeting was held with limited in-person Board members and staff. The Board members and staff, along with the public, were in attendance over a virtual public access site hosted through the Public Teams meeting app. Directions on how to attend this virtual meeting were provided to the public on the Buncombe BOE website.

**Welcome Visitors and Introduction of Remote Meeting Features**

Chairman Jake Quinn welcomed virtual guests. Member Jay Watson was unable to attend.

**Item One – Office Update**

Director Duncan gave the following updates:

- Hiring:
  - The selection of the person filling the Absentee/Training staff position (John Noce's previous position) is being finalized.
  - The other staff position selection/hiring process has been placed on hold because a member of the hiring team has had a death in the family. This hiring process will be resumed next week.

- Early voting begins Thursday June 4, 2020.
  - Early Voting staff training is taking place tomorrow (Wednesday June 3, 2020).
  - Dates and times on Website (June 4-20<sup>th</sup>).
    - 8am to 6pm weekdays
    - Only weekend day is last day Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> 8am -3pm.
- Soil and Water Candidate filing begins Monday June 8, 2020
  - Can file
    - Online
    - In-person – will need to make appointment with Victoria Pickens
- School Board and Municipality Filing will begin July 6, 2020 and same procedures will be followed. This has been posted on our website.
- COVID-19 procedures. SBOE issued a numbered memo 2020-12 giving guidance on procedures during the voting process. Director Duncan is preparing a press release to notify the public. This has been previously posted but will be repeated with the incorporation of SBOE guidance.
- Two events causing fear for voters between Protests and the pandemic. Director Duncan wants to be sure voters know that we are addressing these and doing everything we can to keep the voter safe. No form of voter intimidation will be tolerated.
- Chairman Quinn pointed out how the Board room has been changed to better protect board members and staff:
  - acrylic barriers between each person
  - all attendees wearing a mask
  - virtual meeting to enable public to attend

## **Item Two –Consideration of Absentee Ballot Applications Civilian, Overseas and Military**

Absentee process has been modified to adhere to social distancing and maintaining PPE protocol for all Board Members and staff safe. SBOE John Noce is present to help with the processing of the Absentee Ballots.

- Bobbie Johnston (Absentee staff) reviewed the current absentee voting process:
  - Registered voter must request an absentee ballot from the county in which they are registered
    - Either download the form from the SBE or BOE website
    - Pick-up a form from the BOE office
    - Staff mails the form to voter
  - Staff will review the form is complete and verify
    - Voter is registered within the county
    - Enter information in the VoterView system and all information is correct
    - Note for which election the ballot is requested
    - Second person reviews this information to be sure all has been entered correctly, including the ballot mailing address



- Ballot is mailed out to the requested address
- Voter completes the ballot, signs the back of the ballot envelop and has either two witnesses sign, complete information and date OR notary witnesses and signs the back of the ballot envelop.
  - Voter can either mail the ballot envelop or brings it in-person to our office.
- The returned absentee ballot envelop is reviewed by staff to be complete and the date received is entered into our system.
  - Complete forms are presented to the Board for a final review and then opened and counted.
  - Incomplete forms (such as lacking voter signature or witnesses) are mailed a second ballot, the following morning, indicating to them what was deficient in the first ballot. The first ballot has been entered into the system as having been received by BOE.
    - Most common error is the voter not signing the back of the ballot envelop
    - Also, missing the two witnesses' signatures and or addresses on the back of the envelope.
  - Staff Johnston verified to Chairman Quinn that the voter signatures are verified with the signature on file for both the ballot request form and the ballot return envelope. Also, the difficulty of finding where the signatures are required on the back of the ballot envelope.
    - Occasionally, a spouse or family member will attempt to sign for the voter. This is not accepted.
  - Chairman Quinn mentioned legislation (HB-1169) passed through the NC House and now in the NC Senate is proposing to reduce the requirement of two witness signatures or notary to one witness signature. This is currently only for the COVID pandemic and is not permanent.
  - Deadline for requesting an absentee ballot for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Primary is June 16, 2020 (one week prior to election).
  - Member Block asked for reconfirmation that any registered voter may request an absentee ballot from their county BOE in NC. Chairman Quinn emphasized voters should go and submit their absentee ballot request forms for November and to complete them with appropriate social distancing and safe measures.
- Staff Neggy Fox presented absentee applications with ballots.
  - The Board reviews the ballot applications in a Bipartisan Board team. Only one Republican board member was present (Stephen G. Duncan) so the other Board members rotated through the team to experience the new COVID protocol. Additionally, Staff Kevin Roberts was called on to fill out a second bipartisan Board team during the review of the civilian absentee ballots.
    - The Bipartisan Board team reviewed the UOCAVA ballots for completeness and signed the one overseas ballot and one military ballot. The two signed electronically submitted ballots were passed on to the four member ballot



duplicating bi-partisan team(s) made up of the following staff members: Joyce Kanavel, Daphne Young, Kevin Roberts, and Bobbie Johnston.

- Chairman Quinn inquired whether all calls and marks were clearly heard and seen, and the duplication team answered affirmatively.
- Staff Fox presented 154 civilian applications containing ballots.
  - The Board reviewed and signed the 154 civilian absentee applications containing ballots.
  - Staff Johnston explained that, additionally, there were 27 incomplete ballot applications (14 of which were missing voter signatures). They have been sent a second ballot. Chairman Quinn asked that data be collected to notify the SBE after the election.
  - Staff Johnston presented a letter from a voter who is isolated because of COVID and cannot meet the two witness or notary requirements. The Board discussed this in detail as to his various options – curbside voting and virtual notary. The Board wanted to make sure the voter understands he has two weeks to attempt to complete his ballot application. The voter had submitted an unwitnessed ballot and did not want a second ballot sent to him.
- Chairman Quinn motioned to approve the 156 absentee ballots (154 Civilian, 1 Military, and 1 Overseas), Member Duncan seconded the motion, and the Board approved the absentee ballots unanimously.
- Member Newman mentioned the One-Stop voting information located on our website. Including the wait time feature so folks can check this prior to going to a voting location during Early Voting and on Election Day..
- Director Corinne mentioned that you can subscribe to the Board meeting notice and also be notified when minutes are posted on the website. Member Block reiterated that the website provides information as to the meetings and agenda.
- Chairman Quinn asked for periodic updates on absentee ballot requests for the November General Election received currently and compared to past election years. This will help determine how to plan for staffing. Staff Johnston mentioned there are currently over 1000 absentee ballot requests for November General Election. SBOE Noce mentioned that the State is in the process of improving the Absentee Ballot application (envelope) before the November General Election.

### **Item Three – One-Stop Machine Testing (at 50 Coxe Ave, began at 6:52pm)**

- Staff Allan Johnson explained that according to General Statute 163-33.2 the Board shall test voting machines, in a reasonable number of combinations, no less than ten percent (10%) of all voting machines programmed for each primary or election. With one early voting location for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Primary only one set of equipment was required and so 100% of machines were tested.

- The Board tested one (1) DS200 machine and one (1) ExpressVote machine.

The following machines were tested:

- Results were accurate with no issues noted.

### **Public Comments**

No questions or comments were submitted by virtual attendees.

### Numbered Memo 2020-12

**TO:** County Boards of Elections  
**FROM:** Karen Brinson Bell, Executive Director  
**RE:** COVID-19 Response Planning for In-Person Voting for June 23, 2020 election  
**DATE:** June 1, 2020

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We are issuing guidance to you to help you plan for in-person voting in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. The guidance in this memo is for the June 23, 2020 second primary in Congressional District 11 and new primary in Columbus County. We will issue updated guidance for the November 3, 2020 general election.

The guidance outlined in this numbered memo has been established according to *Recommendations for Election Polling Locations*, issued by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on March 27, 2020, as well as information provided by the CDC to the National Association of Election Directors (NAED) on May 12, 2020. We have also reviewed the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)'s *Pandemic Preparedness in the Workplace and the Americans with Disabilities Act*, updated on March 21, 2020.

As outlined in the Governor's Executive Order 141, the State is currently in Phase 2, which prohibits most mass gatherings of more than 10 people in a single indoor space. Elections are an essential government function and are exempt from the prohibition on mass gatherings. However, county boards of elections, elections officials, voters, and observers should follow social distancing recommendations and other health and safety measures as outlined in this numbered memo. We anticipate that this guidance may be supplemented or modified for the general election as conditions change, including if additional waves of the virus occur later this year.

County boards conducting elections on June 23 have already received information about the supplies they will receive. We will provide specifics about PPE for the general election once funding is allocated and we have additional information.



## Use of PPE and Supplies

### Pollworkers and Early Voting Workers

**After reviewing guidance from the CDC, we have determined that it is necessary for pollworkers and early voting workers to wear PPE to reduce the risk of disease transmission as outlined in this memo. Use of PPE will protect voters and election officials and help ensure that voting places are able to remain open.<sup>1</sup>**

All pollworkers and early voting workers will be provided with and required to wear masks while on duty, in accordance with CDC guidelines. Pollworkers and early voting workers should wear gloves when the task allows and when necessary, such as when cleaning or disinfecting surfaces. The State Board will provide masks and gloves to county boards of elections. Counties may need to supplement if additional supplies are needed.

Pollworkers and early voting workers should wash their hands with soap and water, or use provided hand sanitizer, frequently. This includes after removing gloves. Hand sanitizer will be distributed to you, in 8-ounce or 1-gallon containers, as needed. We will also be providing disinfecting wipes to you.

Used PPE and cleaning supplies may be disposed of as regular trash.

### Voters

Voters will be strongly encouraged to wear face coverings and will be provided with a face covering if they do not have one. A sufficient supply of masks will be ordered to make a mask available to each voter who wants one. **Voters will not be turned away if they choose not to wear a face mask.**

Voters should be encouraged to use hand sanitizer when entering and exiting the polling place. Hand sanitizer should not be located at the ballot table, voting machines, or voting booths.

### Face Shields and Protective Shields

Pollworkers and early voting workers will be provided with face shields, protective goggles, or protective glasses. County boards of elections may opt to use tabletop protective shields, sneeze guards, or physical barriers such as partitions, where feasible. North Carolina Emergency Management provided face shields, which shipped directly to the county emergency management

warehouse. You should contact your county emergency management office if you are conducting an election on June 23 and have not yet received face shields. Counties may construct or procure protective shields or barriers, which will qualify as a reimbursable item, or the State may procure these for the counties.

#### Thermometers and Screening

**Voters will not be screened for fever or other symptoms and will not be turned away.** Individuals may have COVID-19 even if they do not have any symptoms, and the protective measures outlined in the memo are being put in place to help prevent the transmission of disease in the event contagious individuals present to vote.

We do not anticipate requiring that pollworkers or early voting workers have their temperature taken when they report for work, and we will not provide thermometers. **Pollworkers and early voting workers should be asked to self-screen for symptoms or exposure and report to the CBE if they are unable to work because of symptoms or exposure.**

#### Pens/Cotton Swabs

Each voter will receive a one-time use pen and/or cotton swab for use at check in and to mark their ballot while in the voting booth or on the voting equipment. Cotton swabs will be used as styluses for touch screen voting equipment in order to prevent the voter from having to touch the screen.

Pollworkers or early voting workers should provide the pen and/or cotton swab to the voter in a way that reduces unnecessary contact. For example, a pollworker or early voting worker might place pens on a table for voters to pick up or hand them to voters as they wait in line or check in. This worker should regularly change their gloves. Voters may dispose of the device in the appropriate receptacle after voting or keep it. You should plan to provide trash cans or receptacles at the exit of the polling place.

Pollworkers and early voting workers should be instructed to use the same pen the entire day and not share it with anyone. Pollworkers and early voting workers should use cotton swabs on touch screen voting equipment and dispose of the swabs as needed.

#### “I Voted” Stickers

Because health and safety are paramount, we are recommending against handing out “I Voted” stickers this election. While we are not prohibiting issuance of “I Voted” stickers, stickers should not be handed out unless this can be done in a way that minimizes unnecessary contact and exposure to disease. If your office determines that it will continue to issue stickers, pollworkers and early voting workers should not hand the sticker directly to voters. Instead, you may consider placing pre-cut stickers spread out on a table or using a machine that will automatically dispense a new sticker to each person.



## Privacy Sleeves

Curbside voters will use a plastic privacy sleeve and clip board that the pollworker or early voting worker will wipe down with a disinfecting wipe or spray after each use. Voters will also receive a one-time use pen. Pollworkers and early voting workers should avoid sharing pens with the voter.

## Social Distancing

It is important that you encourage the use of social distancing strategies to increase the space between individuals and decrease the frequency of contact among individuals to reduce the risk of spreading disease. Attempting to keep individuals at least 6 feet apart is ideal based on what is known about COVID-19. If this is not feasible, efforts should be made to keep individuals as far apart as practical based on the size and space of your facilities.

A best practice is for each voting place to be set up to allow pollworkers or early voting workers to be 6 feet away from each other and away from each voter. In some cases, this will require the use of larger polling places and additional tables and/or stations. For example, you might place two long tables together along their long edge to allow pollworkers or and early voting workers to be seated at one site and voters to approach at the other side. The distance between voting booths and voting equipment should be increased to account for social distancing if possible.

Voters should be encouraged to maintain social distancing from other individuals, with the exception of family or household members. Pollworkers or early voting workers should provide markings, cones, or other barriers to keep voters who are waiting in line 6 feet apart. The State Board will be providing rolls of painter's tape to mark off the floor if needed.

Voters, pollworkers, and early voting workers should be discouraged from greeting others with physical contact such as handshakes. If possible, you should also provide signage at each voting place regarding social distancing and sanitary measures.

You should also provide one-way directional signage throughout the precinct, as well as clearly marked signs for where voters should enter and exit.

## Voting Equipment at the Voting Place

### Pollbooks

During early voting and in some counties on Election Day, voters are checked in using electronic pollbooks. Electronic pollbooks should be sanitized according to computer manufacturer's instructions any time a new pollworker or early voting worker will touch the computer and regularly throughout the day. You may also consider using a changeable keyboard cover. Paper pollbooks may not be easy to sanitize, so precinct officials should change their gloves if they need to switch locations.



## Voting Booths and Voting Equipment

Voting booths and voting equipment touched by the voter, such as touchscreen machines and the Automark, must be cleaned according to vendor-recommended guidance after each use. You must always follow the cleaning methods specified by the manufacturer. ES&S and Hart Inter-Civic have provided guidance for proper cleaning of their equipment. Please review the appropriate document carefully and ensure that your pollworkers and early voting workers have sufficient supplies and training to clean the equipment after each voter.

Manufacturer guidance is available on the EAC's website.<sup>2</sup>

## Additional Roles Due to COVID-19

In addition to the usual roles assigned to precinct officials, consider the following if possible:

### Interior Line Control Worker

Remind voters inside the room to maintain a 6-foot distance while in line.

### Door Control Worker

Will regulate the number of voters allowed into the building to comply with COVID-19 restrictions.

### Exterior Line Control Worker

Reminds voters in line outside the voting place to maintain a 6-foot distance while in line.

### Sanitizer Worker

Will frequently wipe down tables, voting booths, voting machines, and other surfaces with cleaning supplies.
