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Overview & Purpose

- No major ordinance revisions or updates since 2007
- Required to align to current standards set by North Carolina
- Safeguard and meet mission of preventing loss of life and preserving property from fire loss
- Increase opportunities to enhance resident and visitor safety
- Provide service and education to businesses and internal / external customers





Overview & Purpose

- North Carolina Fire Chief Consulting completed an evaluation of the Fire Marshal's Office
- Final report included a major and overall recommendation to make required revisions to align to North Carolina statutes that address the following:
 - Investigations and Requirements
 - Periodic Inspections Frequencies
 - Remediation
 - New Open Burning Ordinance





Proposed Revisions & Updates (In Red)





- Any owner or occupant failing to comply with such order within a reasonable period after service shall be subject to a penalty of \$100.00 \$500.00 for each violation deemed to be "Life Safety" and \$25.00 \$100.00 per violation for every other violation.
- The service of any such order may be made upon the occupant of the premises to whom it is directed, either by delivering a copy to such occupant personally, electronic delivery (email), or by leaving it with any person in charge of the premises, or if no such person is found upon the premises, by affixing a copy thereof in a conspicuous place or on the door to the entrance of said premises.
- The county fire marshal shall submit an annual report of activities to the County Manager Emergency Services Director, which shall contain all proceedings under this ordinance and any recommendations for amendments which the fire marshal deems appropriate.
- Appendices and Hazardous Material
- The fire marshal may shall require warning signs wherever hazardous materials are stored, processed, or handled. Such warning signs shall be conspicuously lettered in accordance with NFPA 704.



- ADOPT APPENDIX B OF THE NORTH CAROLINA FIRE PREVENTION CODE IN IT'S ENTIRETY. This appendix deals with required fire water flows for sprinklers and hydrants on commercial building projects.
- ADOPT APPENDX D OF THE NORTH CAROLINA FIRE PREVENTION CODE IN IT'S ENTIRETY. This appendix is critical to Buncombe County. It specifies minimum ingress, egress, cul-desac and other emergency services access issues.
 - State law requires adoption by the governing body to make these enforceable.
 - To be moved from the appendices in the 2024 revision cycle



Open Burning

- Air Quality Ordinance- Chapter 26 Article III (Ord. No. 14014, art. IV, § II, 1-11-71) General.
 - A person shall not kindle or maintain or authorize to be kindled or maintained any open burning unless conducted and approved in accordance with this ordinance and the Air Quality Ordinance- Chapter 26 Article III (Ord. No. 14014, art. IV, § II, 1-11-71)
 - Prohibited open burning. (Non-Vegetative Waste)
 - Fire Marshal authority over open burning.
 - Required prescribed burning for wildfire and eradication.
 - Extinguishment Authority.
 - Location for burning and setbacks.





Open Burning, cont.d

- Permit Requirements.
- Bonfires and Recreational Fires.
- Exceptions and approved container and devices.
- Violations including civil and criminal penalties.





Proposed Next Steps

- Request for Board Action August 1st BOCC Regular Meeting
- Develop & Implement Public Education Campaign in coordination with CAPE – 14 days
- Enforcement effective 30 days after the end of campaign period
