What do I need to know about getting the vaccine?

- There will be enough vaccine for us all.
 You will have a spot to take your shot!
 Hundreds of thousands in western
 North Carolina have gotten theirs!
- The vaccines help prevent COVID-19.
 They keep people out of the hospital and prevent death.
- You can't get COVID-19 from the vaccine.

 But, you may have short-term side effects like a sore arm, fever, or headache.

 You could feel tired or achy. For most people, this will go away in a day or two.

- The vaccines are free, even if you don't have health insurance.
- You do not need an ID card to get a vaccine.
 But you may be asked for a name, address or
 birth date. This is so we know who has had
 their shot. Also so that staff can contact you
 about your shot if needed. This information is
 not shared with CDC, ICE or any other group.
- Even after getting the shot, you should still take steps to stop the spread of COVID-19.
 Follow the 3 Ws—wear a mask, wait 6 feet apart from others and wash your hands.
