

LOCAL JAIL POPULATION YEAR OVER YEAR




BOOKINGS YEAR OVER YEAR

By Process Type




By Charge Type

SUMMARY

- Last month the jail housed more people per 100,000 than it had for the month of May over the previous four years
- The rate of racial disparity in the jail has remained higher than pre-pandemic levels despite population numbers returning to pre-pandemic levels
- 12-month recidivism rates for new charges, including violent charges, have remained relatively stable over the last five years
- 12-month recidivism rates for failure to appear (FTA) only and bookings with FTAs are returning to pre-pandemic levels
- Bookings with new charges remain lower than pre-pandemic levels, driven mostly misdemeanor charges
- Average length of stay continues to increase; bookings with FTAs stay in custody longer than bookings without
