The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council having studied the needs of juveniles in the county hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The North Carolina Department of Public Safety (NCDPS) anticipates annual funds in the above stated amount will be available for programs serving delinquent and at-risk youth beginning on or after July 1, 2022. Awarded funds must be spent by June 30, 2023. Local match rate for JCPC funds required: 30%.

Based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the service continuum, the following program types will be considered for funding:

- 1. Runaway/Temporary Shelter
- 2. Comprehensive Clinical Assessments (CCAs)
- 3. Restitution/Community Service
- 4. Teen Court/Restorative Services
- 5. Substance Use Services

- 6. Parent / Family Skill Building
- 7. Vocational Skills
- 8. Interpersonal or Experiential Skills
- 9. Structured Day / Tutoring / Academic Enhancement / Mentoring

As a result of the Risk Assessment and YASI data in the Buncombe County, programs that reduce risk, address the needs of youth involved with the juvenile justice system, and increase protective factors will be considered for funding:

Private nonprofits are also required to submit in NC ALLIES, No Overdue Tax forms, Conflict of Interest Statements, and, if requested, proof of 501(c)(3) status.

- Current programs requesting additional funds should submit a budget revision in NC ALLIES and email JCPC Admin Hannah.Legerton@buncombecounty.org a summary detailing the amount of the request and purpose for additional funds. Additional funds require a 30% match.
- **NEW applicants are required to attend a mandatory orientation** (prior applicants may also attend).
