There are precious few opportunities for people of different ethnic backgrounds, economic levels or ages to sit down together and discuss ideas that are important to them. This project provides that opportunity."

The book chosen for this summer's Town Wide Read is *One Foot in Eden* by Ron Rash. The library has plenty of books in circulation for people to check out, and the Friends of Fairview Library will be selling copies of the book for \$5.00 to anyone that would like to own one.
